3 COMMENDING MAYOR BROWN AND THE MAYOR'S OFFICE ON
4 HOMELESSNESS FOR SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE CITY TO THE HOMELESS.

5 WHEREAS, A national study was recently conducted by the U.S. Department
6 of Housing and Urban Development on homelessness and homeless services provided
7 in several cities nationwide; and,

8
9 WHEREAS, The study revealed that in 1996 there was an estimated 12,410
10 people in San Francisco shelters, and that for every 10,000 people living below the
11 poverty line, San Francisco provided shelter for 860 persons; and,

13 WHEREAS, Per capita, San Francisco provides services for more persons than
14 any other U.S. city, including much larger cities such as New York, Los Angeles,
15 Chicago, Philadelphia, and Boston; and,

17 WHEREAS, The study further determined that nationwide, between 60
18 percent and 76 percent of the homeless successfully left shelters for permanent
19 housing when they received the services they needed, such as housing subsidies, health
20 care, substance abuse treatment, education, and job training, services which are
21 provided by the City of San Francisco; now, therefore be it

23 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San
24 Francisco extends its highest commendation to Mayor Brown and the Mayor's Office
25 on Homelessness for services provided by the City to the homeless.
