3 COMMENDING THE REVEREND JESSE JACKSON, DR. REV. JOAN BROWN CAMPELL
4 AND THE MISSION OF UNITED STATES RELIGIOUS LEADERS FOR SECURING THE
5 RELEASE OF THE THREE AMERICAN SOLDIERS WHO HAD BEEN HELD IN CAPTIVITY
6 BY YUGOSLAVIAN AUTHORITIES FOR MORE THAN A MONTH AND URGING
7 PRESIDENT CLINTON AND NATO TO SEIZE UPON PRESIDENT MILOSEVIC'S DECISION
8 TO RELEASE THOSE PRISONERS AS AN OPPORTUNITY TO PURSUE PEACE AND
9 DIPLOMACY IN LIEU OF CONTINUED HOSTILITIES WITH BELGRADE.

11 WHEREAS, Rev. Jackson and Dr. Rev. Joan Brown Campell led a mission of United
12 States religious leaders on a humanitarian effort to Belgrade to make a moral appeal for the
13 release of the three American prisoners; and,

14 WHEREAS, The "faith mission," left Dulles Airport on Wednesday, April 28th and flew to
15 Germany where the delegation traveled by bus to the Belgrade; and,

17 WHEREAS, On Saturday, May 1, 1999, Rev. Jackson and Rep. Rod Blagojevich met
18 with the three American soldiers in a detention facility; and,

19 WHEREAS, On that day, Rev. Jackson also met with President Slobodan Milosevic;

22 WHEREAS, Early on the morning of May 2, 1999, Rev. Jackson emerged from the
23 Belgrade holding facility with the 3 former prisoners of war; now therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors commends Rev. Jackson, Dr. Rev. Joan
2 Brown Campell and the mission of United States religious leaders for securing the release of
3 the three American soldiers who had been held in captivity by Yugoslavian authorities for
4 more than a month; and, be it

5 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges President
6 Clinton and NATO to seize upon President Milosevic's decision to release those prisoners as
7 an opportunity to pursue peace and diplomacy in lieu of continued hostilities with Belgrade.




