2	Resolution authorizing the Recreation and Park Department to accept and expend a
4	bequest in the amount of approximately \$3,600,000 from the estate of William Benjamin
5	Bobo to provide benches, park furnishings and park improvements at various park
6	sites across San Francisco, effective upon approval of this Resolution.
7	
8	WHEREAS, William Benjamin Bobo, a resident of the City and County of San
9	Francisco, died testate on August 12, 2023; and
10	WHEREAS, On January 29, 2024, the Superior Court of the State of California
11	admitted the Decedent's Will dated April 20, 2022 ("Will") to probate and appointed Kim
12	Ridinger executor; and
13	WHEREAS, The Will provides that the Department is to receive eighty percent (80%) of
14	the residue of the Decedent's estate, which distribution is estimated to be approximately
15	\$3,600,000; and
16	WHEREAS, The Will indicated that the distribution to the Department is to be used for
17	the purpose of placing newly built park benches in San Francisco parks which are to display
18	plaques stating, "In Memory of Ben, Rory, and Chad"; and
19	WHEREAS, The Department determined that the Bequest greatly outmatches the
20	intended purpose and worked with the executor to modify the uses of the Bequest while
21	fulfilling its spirit; and
22	WHEREAS, The parties mutually agreed that the Department would utilize the Bequest
23	in three primary ways as follows; and
24	WHEREAS, 40%, approximately \$1,440,000 will be allocated to implement a portion of
25	the Alta Plaza Park master plan including installing one bench plaque in a prominent location

with a dedication stating, "*In Memory of Ben, Rory and Chad.*" The decedent, his partner, and
 their dog lived near Alta Plaza Park; and

WHEREAS, The Alta Plaza Master Plan was adopted by the Recreation and Parks Commission on April 21, 2016; use of funds include making repairs to concrete elements and replacing asphalt pathways with concrete paving; unifying site furniture and signage; replacing 11 benches and adding 20 new benches on the south and east terraces; and addressing Park accessibility. In honor of the bequest, donor recognition will be added to the existing Alta Plaza donor circle approved in the 2016 Alta Plaza Master Plan; and

9 WHEREAS, 20%, approximately \$720,000 will be allocated to build and install
10 approximately 50 new benches and other park furnishings; each park site will include one
11 plaque with the dedication, "*In Honor of Ben, Rory and Chad*"; and

WHEREAS, 40%, approximately \$1,440,000 will be allocated to support the
Department's capital project(s) or refurbishments, including but not limited to dog play areas,
new parks, and playgrounds, with donor recognition of Decedent's bequest; recognition will
comply with the Recreation and Park Commission donor recognition policies and will honor
Ben, Rory and Chad; and

LAST WILL OF WILLIAM BENJAMIN BOBO

I, WILLIAM BENJAMIN BOBO, also known as W. BENJAMIN BOBO, W. BEN BOBO, WILLIAM BEN BOBO, and BEN BOBO, a resident of the City and County of San Francisco, California, declare that this is my will. I hereby revoke all my previous wills and codicils.

ARTICLE ONE

INTRODUCTORY PROVISIONS

1.1. <u>No Spouse or Partner</u>. I am not currently married and I do not have a domestic partner,

1.2. No Living or Deceased Children. I have no living or deceased children.

1.3. <u>No Contract Affecting Will</u>. I have not entered into any contract to make a will or a testamentary gift, not to revoke a will or a testamentary gift, or to die intestate.

1.4. <u>No Exercise of Power of Appointment</u>. I intentionally refrain from exercising any power of appointment that I now possess or that hereafter may be conferred on me.

1.5. <u>Disinheritance</u>. Other than the family members included in this will, I intentionally and with full knowledge of the consequences do not provide in this will for my relatives. All provisions of this will shall be interpreted as though my family members who are not included have each predeceased me without issue.

ARTICLE TWO

GIFTS OF PROPERTY

2.1. <u>Monetary Gifts</u>. I give to each of the following persons the sum of money specified. Any estate or inheritance tax imposted with respect to any of these gifts shall be paid from the

residue of my estate. If any listed person fails to survive me then the gift to that person shall lapse:

- (a) ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000) to my niece, SUSAN C. BOBO;
- (b) FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$50,000) to my niece, PAULA BOBO HALLENBECK;
- (c) SEVENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$75,000) to my niece, MAILE CARR EDDY;
- (d) TWENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$25,000) to MELISSA MURPHY, in memory of her grandmother, MINYA MURPHY;
- (e) TWENTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$25,000) to my niece, MALIA CARR FRANKLIN;
- (f) TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$10,000) to HELEN MARKANTON; and
- (g) TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$10,000) to MALCOM McNAIR.
- 2.2. <u>Tangible Personal Property</u>. My nieces, MAILE CARR EDDY and SUSAN C.

BOBO, or the survivor of them, may have any of my furniture, furnishings, artwork, and other tangible personal property that they wish. All expenses related to MAILE CARR EDDY's and/or SUSAN C. BOBO's travel to my residence to select what they want, and all expenses related to packing and shipping the selected items to them shall be paid from the residue of my estate. Any tangible personal property that remains shall be donated to the SALVATION ARMY, or other similar charitable organization in the executor's discretion.

- 2.3. <u>Residue</u>. I give all of my remaining property as follows:
- (a) TWENTY PERCENT (20%) to the SAN FRANCISCO SOCIETY FOR THE PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS, TIN: 94-0836580, 201 Alabama Street, San Francisco, California, in memory of BEN, RORY AND CHAD.
- (b) EIGHTY PERCENT (80%) to the CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO to be used for the sole purpose of placing newly built park benches in San Francisco parks that bear plaques stating "IN MEMORY OF BEN, RORY AND CHAD."

2.4. <u>Pay on Death Designations</u>. I have intentionally named pay on death beneficiaries for some of my assets, and it is my understanding and intention that my Will shall not dispose of those assets. However, if any of said assets are returned to my estate, for example if the designated beneficiary does not survive me and there is no contingent beneficiary, or if I have named my estate as beneficiary, then my Will shall dispose of said assets.

ARTICLE THREE

EXECUTOR

3.1. <u>Nomination of Executor</u>. I nominate my former accountant, KIM RIDINGER, as executor of this will. If KIM RIDINGER is unable or unwilling to act as executor, then I nominate SUSAN C. BOBO to serve as executor.

3.2. <u>Waiver of Bond</u>. No bond or undertaking shall be required of any executor nominated in this will.

3.3. <u>General Powers of Executor</u>. The executor shall have full authority to administer my estate under the California Independent Administration of Estates Act. The executor shall have all powers now or hereafter conferred on executors by law, except as otherwise specifically provided in this will, including any powers enumerated in this will.

3.4. <u>Power to Invest</u>. The executor shall have the power to invest estate funds in any kind of real or personal property, as the executor deems advisable.

3.5. Division or Distribution in Cash or in Kind. In order to satisfy a pecuniary gift or to distribute or divide estate assets into shares or partial shares, the executor may distribute or divide those assets in kind, or divide undivided interests in those assets, or sell all or any part of those assets and distribute or divide the property in cash, in kind, or partly in cash and partly in kind. Property distributed to satisfy a pecuniary gift under this will shall be valued at its fair market value at the time of distribution.

3.6. <u>Power to Sell, Lease, and Grant Options to Purchase Property</u>. The executor shall have the power to sell, at either public or private sale and with or without notice, lease, and grant options to purchase any real or personal property belonging to my estate, on such terms and conditions as the executor determines to be in the best interest of my estate.

3.7. Power to Continue Operation of a Business. My executor may either (1) continue the operation of a business belonging to my estate for as long as the executor considers it to be in the best interests of the estate or (2) sell or liquidate the business on terms and conditions that the executor considers proper. My executor shall not be liable for any losses resulting from the operation, sale, or liquidation of the business, unless the executor acts in bad faith, is grossly negligent, or engages in willful misconduct.

3.8. Power Over Digital Assets. My executor has the power to access, handle, and dispose of my digital assets. The term "digital assets" has the same meaning as set forth in Probate Code §871 or applicable successor statute and includes but is not limited to files stored on my digital devices, including desktops, laptops, tablets, peripherals, storage devices, mobile telephones, smart phones, and any similar digital device. The term "digital assets" also includes e-mails, blog posts, documents, images, audio, video, and similar digital files stored in a digital account. My executor has the power to access, handle, and dispose of my digital accounts, including e-mail accounts, blogs, software licenses, social network accounts, social media accounts, file-sharing and storage accounts, financial management accounts, domain registration accounts, online stores, and affiliate programs. <u>Consent to Disclosure of Electronic</u> Communications: My executor's authority is intended to constitute my "consent to disclosure of electronic communications" under the Revised Uniform Fiduciary Access to Digital Assets Act (RUFADAA) (Prob C §§870–884) and express consent under the Stored Communications Act

(SCA) (18 USC §§2701–2713) or applicable successor statute, and the Computer Fraud and Abuse Act (CFAA) (18 USC §1030) or applicable successor statute, to the extent such consent is required.

3.9. Payment of Costs Incurred by Executor if SUSAN C. BOBO is Serving. If SUSAN C. BOBO is serving as executor of my estate, then she shall be entitled to reimbursement for all costs that she incurs related to traveling to administer my estate, including those costs that might not otherwise be allowed under California law or local rules of court, including, by way of example, but not limited to: meals, mileage, parking and tolls, car rental fees, plane fare and costs of hotel accommodations, including those for a second person if SUSAN C. BOBO brings someone from home to assist her.

ARTICLE FOUR

CONCLUDING PROVISIONS

4.1. <u>Definition of Death Taxes</u>. The term "death taxes," as used in this will, shall mean all inheritance, estate, succession, and other similar taxes that are payable by any person on account of that person's interest in my estate or by reason of my death, including penalties and interest, but excluding the following:

(a) Any additional tax that may be assessed under Internal Revenue Code Section 2032A.

(b) Any federal or state tax imposed on a "generation-skipping transfer," as that term is defined in the federal tax laws, unless the applicable tax statutes provide that the generation-skipping transfer tax on that transfer is payable directly out of the assets of my gross estate.

4.2. <u>Payment of Death Taxes and Administration Expenses</u>. The executor shall pay death taxes, whether or not attributable to property inventoried in my probate estate, and all expenses of administration from the residue of my estate.

4.3. Definition of Incapacity. As used in this will, "incapacity" or "incapacitated" means

a person operating under a legal disability such as a duly established conservatorship, or a person who is unable to do either of the following:

(a) Provide properly for that person's own needs for physical health, food, clothing, or shelter; or

(b) Manage substantially that person's own financial resources, or resist fraud or undue influence.

The determination of incapacity shall be made by two (2) licensed physicians.

4.4. Number and Gender. As used in this will, references in the masculine gender shall be deemed to include the feminine and neuter gender, and vice versa, and references to the singular shall be deemed to include the plural, and vice versa, wherever the context so permits.

4.5. <u>Captions</u>. The captions appearing in this will are for convenience of reference only, and shall be disregarded in determining the meaning and effect of the provisions of this will.

4.6. Severability Clause. If any provision of this will is invalid, that provision shall be disregarded, and the remainder of this will shall be construed as if the invalid provision had not been included.

4.7. California Law to Apply. All questions concerning the validity and interpretation of this will, including any trusts created by this will, shall be governed by the laws of the State of California in effect at the time this will is executed.
