3 **Resolution to remove all management proposals and activities derived from the Sharp**
4 **Park Conceptual Restoration Alternatives Report's Alternative A18 from the**
5 **Environmental Impact Report for the San Francisco Recreation and Park Department's**
6 **Significant Natural Resource Areas Management Plan, and to consider proposals and**
7 **alternatives for the future of Sharp Park Golf Course through a separate and complete**
8 **California Environmental Quality Act review process.**

10 WHEREAS, The two-fold mission of the Recreation and Park Department's Natural
11 Areas Program (NAP) is to "preserve, restore, and enhance remnant Natural Areas, and to
12 develop and support community-based site stewardship of these areas"; and

13 WHEREAS, The Significant Natural Resource Areas Management Plan (SNRAMP) is
14 intended to guide management activities and site improvements in designated Significant
15 Natural Resource Areas (Natural Areas) in San Francisco and San Mateo Counties by the
16 Recreation and Park Department for the next 20 years; and

17 WHEREAS, The objectives of the SNRAMP are to inventory biological resources in
18 Natural Areas, identify issues and impacts adversely affecting ecosystem functions and
19 biological diversity, prioritize management actions to promote functioning of native
20 ecosystems, provide guidelines for educational and stewardship programs and for "passive
21 recreational uses compatible with the City's natural resources"; and

22 WHEREAS, Sharp Park is located in San Mateo County, miles from the San Francisco
23 County line and the nearest San Francisco-based Natural Area, and has significantly different
24 ecological and administrative issues than other Natural Areas; and

1 WHEREAS, Sharp Park contains breeding and feeding grounds for the Endangered
2 San Francisco garter snake and the Threatened California red-legged frog, which are not
3 found in any of the City's other Natural Areas; and

4 WHEREAS, The planning process for the SNRAMP began in 1995, and has involved
5 the input of multiple stakeholders, including a Citizens Task Force and Green Ribbon Panel
6 convened for the NAP in 2002, a 2003 NAP Citizens Advisory Committee, an ad hoc working
7 group in 2004, a public comment period on the 2005 public draft of the SNRAMP and three
8 independent scientific peer-reviews of the 2005 public draft of the SNRAMP; and

9 WHEREAS, The SNRAMP Final Draft Plan was approved for environmental review in
10 2006, and has completed several steps in the environmental review process since, including
11 the publication of a Notice of Preparation in April 2009; the completion and distribution of an
12 Initial Study to Responsible Agencies in April 2009; and the conclusion of public scoping and
13 comment periods in the summer of 2009; and

14 WHEREAS, In November 2009, Alternative A18 for Sharp Park Golf Course—a project
15 wholly separate from the SNRAMP—was proposed in the Sharp Park Conceptual Restoration
16 Alternatives Report. Alternative A18 calls for extensive dredging of Sharp Park's wetlands,
17 raising the elevation of four golf links, and redesigning three other golf links in an attempt to
18 reduce chronic flooding and drainage issues at the golf course; and

19 WHEREAS, The golf course project in Alternative A18 has not been subjected to
20 California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) procedural and substantive requirements, such
21 as a discussion of the golf course project in a Notice of Preparation and Initial Study; review
22 by or consultation with Responsible Agencies about the golf course project; and formal public
23 comment and review of draft and final golf course project designs; and

1 WHEREAS, By the time the Sharp Park Conceptual Restoration Alternatives Report
2 was released, the SNRAMP had already undergone more than three years of public scrutiny
3 and programmatic environmental review; and

4 WHEREAS, Alternative A18 was nonetheless inserted into the long-standing SNRAMP
5 CEQA review process as a new, additional SNRAMP project before the SNRAMP DEIR was
6 released in August 2011; and

7 WHEREAS, All feasible alternative golf course design and restoration configurations for
8 Sharp Park Golf Course were excluded from consideration in the DEIR with the exception of
9 Alternative A18; and

10 WHEREAS, Sharp Park Golf Course is further characterized as a historic resource for
11 purposes of CEQA in the DEIR, even though on September 21, 2011, San Francisco's
12 Historic Advisory Commission voted that they did not concur with the DEIR's conclusion that
13 Sharp Park Golf Course is an historic resource, and subsequently sent a letter on September
14 26, 2011 to the Recreation and Park Department explaining that they could not reach
15 consensus on the historic integrity of Sharp Park Golf Course; and

16 WHEREAS, The management of this property is currently in litigation due to alleged
17 violations of the federal Endangered Species Act; and

18 WHEREAS, Alternative A18 should be subject to a separate and complete
19 environmental evaluation; now, therefore, be it

20 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
21 directs that all Sharp Park Golf Course projects and management proposals derived from
22 Alternative A18 be excised from the SNRAMP EIR and considered in a separate, complete
23 and public CEQA review process.

Dear Supervisors,

I am golf a course architect who has studied the Sharp Park golf course over several years, including the site history, the architecture , the environmental and habitat issues, drainage patterns and much more. I have toured the course with a variety of consultants, all working to find the right ways to SAVE the golf course and enhance frog and snake habitat in the golf course's wetlands. There is no doubt that this can be done.

It has come to my attention that Supervisor Olague has proposed a resolution that would ignore years of studies and require the City's Rec & Park Departments to start over on the Environmental Review process for the Department's Sharp Park Habitat Restoration plan, which would greatly enhance habitat for endangered species, while keeping the 18-hole course open.

Please recognize that Sharp Park is an internationally-known, architecturally significant public golf course, built in the early 1930's by history's greatest golf architect, Alister MacKenzie. This is a San Francisco public architectural treasure, and should be recognized and treated as such by the City's leaders. It is also "the poor man's Pebble Beach," a recreational field for common people of all income levels, walks of life, ethnicities, genders, and persuasions. It is worth saving.

Supervisor Olague's proposed Resolution would require the City to start over on the Sharp Park habitat recovery plan -- thereby wasting 4-plus years of study, planning, consultants, department staff time, and consultants fees. The waste of time, money, and effort would be colossal. It would also delay by years the City's efforts to improve natural habitat at Sharp Park while saving the golf course.

Dear Chairman Mar and Supervisors Cohen and Wiener,

The Pacifica Chamber of Commerce, representing more than 400 businesses in the City of Pacifica, strongly opposes Resolution File No. 120619, sponsored by Supervisor Olague which would sever the Sharp Park Golf Course from the long-pending Significant Natural Resource Areas Management Plan ("SNRAMP") Environmental Impact Report process.

Severance would be extraordinarily wasteful of years of planning, staff and consultant expense, and thousands of hours of community time engaged in the planning and EIR processes at Sharp Park. This represents money, time, and effort wasted. The delay and additional expense would serve no good purpose here.

The Chamber wholeheartedly endorses preserving the 18-hole Sharp Park Golf Course, located in Pacifica which is an 80-year-old community institution here and a source of reasonably priced recreation and community for Pacificans, San Franciscans, and North Peninsula residents alike. The golf course is a cultural and architectural treasure of our community, recognized as an historical resource by the San Francisco Planning Department, the Pacifica Historical Society, the Pacifica General Plan, and the Cultural Landscape Foundation of Washington D.C.

Furthermore, we support the San Francisco Recreation and Park Department's plan to preserve the 18-hole golf course, while at the same time protecting the environment by recovering frog and snake habitat in Sharp Park's lagoons and wetlands. Golf and the environment can co-exist in Pacifica.

Please vote "No" on the Sharp Park resolution, File No. 120619, which would require the City's Rec & Park and Planning Departments to start over on the Environmental Review process for the City's Sharp Park plan (overwhelmingly endorsed by the Rec & Park citizens advisory committee and unanimously adopted by the Rec & Park Commission in December, 2009). Supervisor Olague's Resolution would mean a colossal waste of public time, money, and effort that has gone into the Sharp Park plan. We cannot afford such public waste -- especially not now, in hard economic times, when we need to spend public money carefully.

The City's Sharp Park plan is the result of more than a dozen public meetings in both San Francisco and Pacifica since April, 2009, by several San Francisco public agencies, including the Rec & Park Commission and its citizens advisory committee ("PROSAC"), the SF Public Utilities Commission (on the related issue of the Sharp Park Recycled Water Project), and the Board of Supervisors and its City Audit and Neighborhood Services and Government Audit and Oversight committees.

Sharp Park has been part of the Significant Natural Areas Management Plan since the initial draft plan in 1995. My name is Tony Belway. I have lived in the outer Richmond District for over 50 years. I am sending you this email to urge you to not support the closing of Sharp Park Golf Course.

I have a Bachelor's of Science degree in Zoology, and also golf regularly at Sharp Park, and the other public San Francisco courses. I understand the environmental problems that can be caused by poor golf course management. My concerns are primarily related to water and pesticide use at golf courses. I have researched the Rachel Carson Institute's golf course management recommendations, as well as the Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary Golf course program recommendations.

Sharp Park is possibly the best managed golf course in terms of ecological sensitivity I have ever played, and one of the best in the world. The use of reclaimed water, the staking of environmentally sensitive habitat, the expansion of no-play areas during winter months, and the lack of chemicals used all are examples of their forward approach to golf course management. The habitation of numerous wildlife species is the best evidence of how good a job of course management is done at this park.

No doubt, the creation of the sea wall spanning the western boundary has changed the lagoon from a brackish, salt water environment, into a fresh water lagoon that several species have thrived in. It is because of this sea wall that these species are continuing to survive. The sea wall is also a great resource, as it part of a hiking a bike trail that extends the entire length of the Pacifica. It is a great hiking trail.

The golf course is not a threat to these species – indeed, their populations have been steadily increasing over the years, and funds generated by golf help maintain the sea wall and lagoon. However, the “restoration” project sponsored by the Center for Biological diversity includes the removal of 13,000 trees on 600 acres, as well as bulldozing 200 acres adjacent to the habitat. That is a threat to many other species that inhabit the golf course, including coyotes, hawks, foxes, rabbits numerous birds and other species.

It is a shame our leaders have so far have lacked the vision to see the opportunities at Sharp Park. Expand the access to view habitat with more hiking trails incorporated within in the golf course. Moving two holes to the eastern side of the highway would double the lagoon habitat. Certify the course with Audubon International – showcase Sharp Park as an example of how golf, nature and an urban park can all coexist.

Golfers are willing to pay their part, in higher fees if necessary, but remember, Sharp Park is one of the few economically accessible Golf Courses for City Residents. Harding Park is more than twice as expensive for City residents, and 5 times more expensive for Pacifica residents. And course fees charged by Recreation and Park help fund other recreation programs in the city.

Hello,

I am Arnita Bowman from San Bruno and a frequent visitor to San Francisco parks and respectfully request that the resolution to separate Sharp Park from the SNRAMP EIR be denied.

It is important that the environmental impact of ideological policy decisions be considered cumulatively. The 2006 Significant Natural Resource Areas Plan represents an ideology that deifies native plants and endangered species in a misguided attempt to turn back the clock in city park lands. This purist ideology is overall harmful to the people and wildlife that currently rely on these park lands and is far from benign.

If anything, instead of reducing the review scope to obscure the full impact of the policy decision, the environmental review process should be expanded to include all the ongoing projects in San Francisco and the nearby Peninsula that are based on this ideology and are already stripping trees and wildlife habitat, escalating toxic herbicide spraying, and closing or preventing recreation such as hiking, golf, bike parks, disc golf courses, dog play areas, etc.

Specific to Sharp Park, it is important keep in mind that just over the hill is the 20,000+ SF Peninsula Watershed, a wildlife preserve owned by SF, which is the SF Peninsula critical habitat for the California Red-Legged Frog and is also reported as a habitat for the SF Garter Snake. The frog populations in the Sierras and southern California are most threatened, not those on the central coast. While the frog is a viable species and is doing well at Sharp Park and nearby locations, the existence of a pure SF Garter Snake population at Sharp Park seems questionable with or without the restoration. From what I've read, it is also questionable whether this garter snake is truly a unique subspecies from other common garter snakes or just a local color variation.

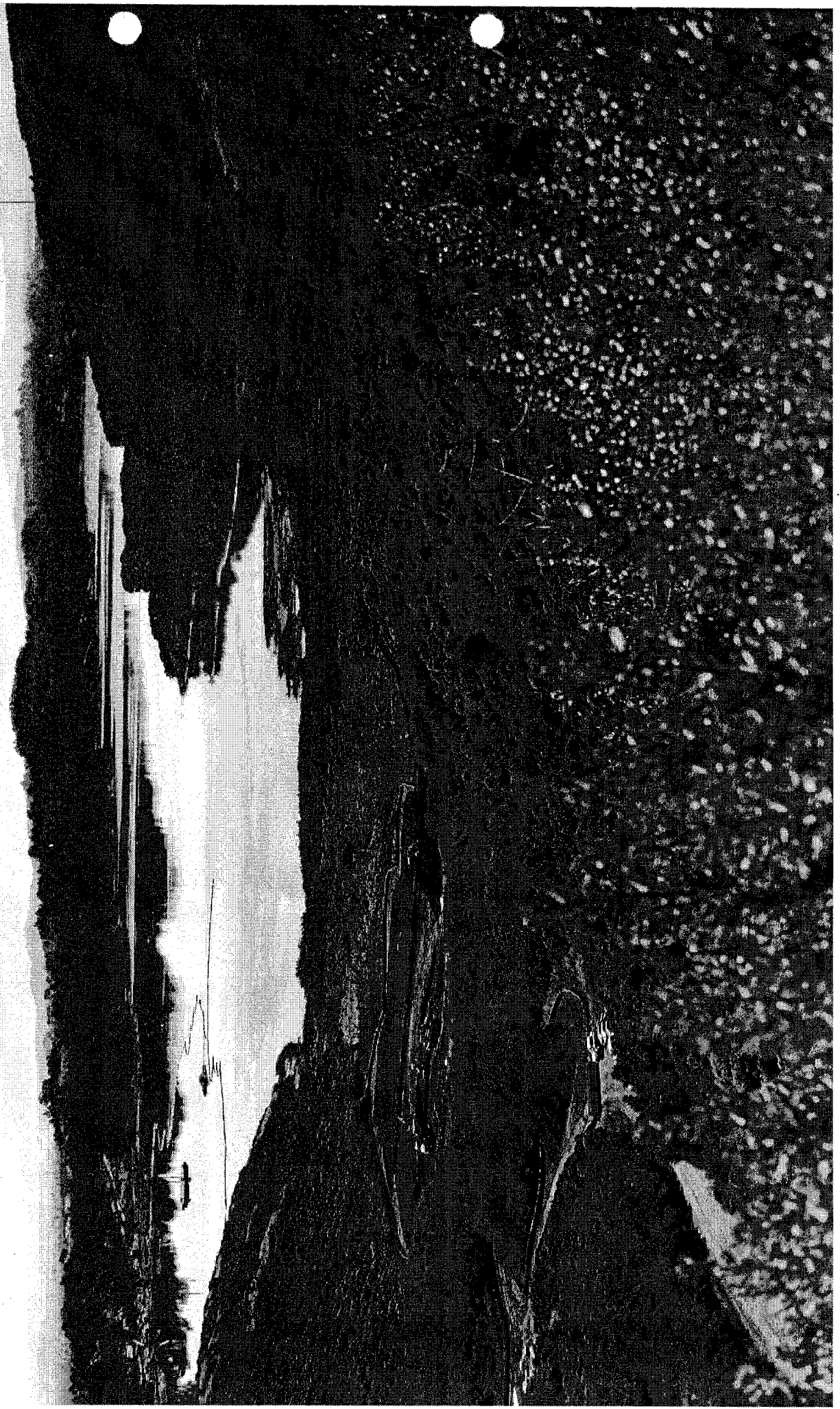
At a time of financial uncertainty, San Francisco residents are already doing much for the red-legged frog, the elusive SF garter snake, and other endangered species. In addition to Natural Areas plans, SF is already funding the \$89 million SFPUC habitat restoration project and a \$20 million Watershed Environmental Improvement project related to the SF Public Utilities Commission \$4 Billion Water System Improvement Program (WSIP) project. Attached is a picture of four of the massive frog ponds that are being constructed in the watershed for this SFPUC project. I estimate these ponds are only about 3 miles from the Sharp Park lagoon and from a distance the new ponds look bigger than the lagoon.

I'd also encourage you to read this article with a perspective on the motivations and tactics of the extreme environmental groups. Separating this project will only increase costs, waste time, put recreation in further jeopardy, and obscure the full environmental impacts of extreme conservation ideologies.

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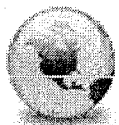
