13	Section 1. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in						
14	this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public						
15	Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the						
16	Board of Supervisors in File No. 141094 and is incorporated herein by reference.						
17	Continue 2. The Environment Code is berefit amondod by odding Continue 400, to read						
18	Section 2. The Environment Code is hereby amended by adding Section 429, to read						
19	as follows:						
20	SEC. 429. GREENHOUSE GAS INFORMATION LABELS FOR GAS PUMPS.						
21	(a) Beginning March 1, 2015, the operator of any Service Station shall post or cause to be						
22	posted on each pump used to dispense gasoline or other motor fuel to the public a legible and						
23	conspicuous label which contains the following statement: "The U.S. Environmental Protection						
24	Agency (EPA) has determined that a typical passenger vehicle burning one gallon of fuel produces on						
25	average almost 20 pounds of tailpipe carbon dioxide (CO2), which the EPA has determined is the

- 4 *each pump or to the top of the nozzle or nozzles for each pump.*
- 5 (b) For purposes of this section, "Service Station" means any establishment which offers for
- 6 <u>sale or sells gasoline or other motor vehicle fuel to the public.</u>
- 7 (c) The Director of the Department of the Environment may, after a noticed public hearing,
- 8 *adopt necessary forms, regulations, and guidelines to implement this Section 429. Within 90 days after*
- 9 *the effective date of the ordinance adopting this Section 429, the Director of the Department of the*
- 10 *Environment shall issue regulations specifying the size, format, and related standards for the labels.*
- 11 (d) The Director of the Department of the Environment or his or her designee may impose
- 12 *administrative fines for violations of this Section 429, or of any rule or regulation adopted pursuant to*
- 13 *this Section. Administrative Code Chapter 100, "Procedures Governing the Imposition of*
- 14 Administrative Fines," as amended, is hereby incorporated in its entirety and shall govern the
- 15 *imposition, enforcement, collection, and review of such administrative citations.*

Section 3. Effective Date; Operative Date. This ordinance shall become effective
30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor
returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it,
or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance. The provisions of
this ordinance shall become operative on January 1, 2015.

23 Section 4. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word 24 of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any 25 court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining

1	portions of the ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have						
2	passed this ordinance and each and every section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, and						
3	word not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to whether any other portion of						
4	this ordinance would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.						
5							
6	Section 5. Undertaking for the General Welfare. In enacting and implementing this						
7	ordinance, the City is assuming an undertaking only to promote the general welfare. It is not						
8	assuming, nor is it imposing on its officers and employees, an obligation for breach of which it						
9	is liable in money damages to any person who claims that such breach proximately caused						
10	injury.						
11							
12	Section 6. No Conflict with Federal or State Law. Nothing in this ordinance shall be						
13	interpreted or applied so as to create any requirement, power, or duty in conflict with any						
14	federal or state law.
