21	Section 1. Findings. The Board of Supervisors finds that:				
22	(a) The City and County of San Francisco (the "City") is currently dealing with an				
23	epidemic of organized retail theft that targets San Francisco businesses, ranging from large				
24	multinational corporations to small local businesses and sole proprietors, often resulting in

- those businesses ceasing operations or delaying or deferring continued investment in
 expansions or upgrades.
 - (b) The businesses targeted by organized retail crime serve a valuable function to the public welfare by providing goods and services to San Francisco residents, or by directly employing San Francisco residents.
 - (c) The City is also dealing with an epidemic of motor vehicle accessory theft (catalytic converter theft) committed by organized theft groups that render the affected vehicles inoperable with thousands of dollars of repairs required. These organized groups often strike under cover of night and have even discharged firearms at police officers, victims, and witnesses who attempt to interrupt their crimes.
 - (d) The affected vehicles belong to San Francisco businesses and residents alike, all of whom rely on these vehicles for their livelihoods, health, and independence.
 - (e) The dual threat of organized retail theft and organized motor vehicle accessory theft (catalytic converter theft) has a severely deleterious effect on the public welfare and requires additional investment and redoubled efforts to combat it.
 - (f) The City desires to participate in, and the Police Department has applied for, the Organized Retail Theft Prevention Grant Program (hereinafter referred to as the "ORT Grant" or the "Grant") funded through the State Budget Act and administered by the Board of State and Community Corrections (hereafter referred to as the "BSCC"), for grant funds up to \$15,650,000 to combat organized retail crime and motor vehicle accessory theft (catalytic converter theft).
 - (g) On September 14, 2023, the City was selected as a Grant awardee by the BSCC.
 - (h) The ORT Grant period is from October 1, 2023 to June 1, 2027.
