WHEREAS, The United States House of Representatives has forwarded a budget for the coming fiscal year which underfunds the Section 8 voucher program and puts approximately 87,000 households at-risk of homelessness; and

WHEREAS, In San Francisco, 17,000 households depend on Section 8 vouchers and approximately 35,000 are on the waiting list for the program; and

WHEREAS, Preserving this resource is an important component of the City's over-all efforts to maintain permanent affordable housing; and

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urge U.S. Senators Dianne Feinstein and Barbara Boxer to take immediate action to fully fund the Section 8 voucher program, so that all current recipients may preserve their housing and those on the waiting list may receive new vouchers in the coming fiscal year.
