WHEREAS, In furtherance of this authority CalRecycle is required to establish procedures governing the administration of the Used Oil Payment Program; and

WHEREAS, CalRecycle's procedures for administering the Used Oil Payment Program require, among other things, an applicant's governing body to declare by resolution certain authorizations related to the administration of the Used Oil Payment Program; and

WHEREAS, The grant is available to the City and County of San Francisco from CalRecycle; and

WHEREAS, Through a recurring grant cycle the City and County of San Francisco has annually entered into agreement with the State of California for implementation of used oil collection programs for the past seventeen (17) years; and

WHEREAS, The grant includes provision for indirect costs of \$10,376.18, and WHEREAS, This grant does not require an ASO amendment, and WHEREAS, The grant was not included in the annual budget process of the City and County of San Francisco but awarded by the State of California, now, therefore, be it
