3 **Resolution urging the Board of Supervisors to save San Francisco Unified School**
4 **District (SFUSD) Senior Class of 2021 activities by providing support, funds and/or city**
5 **resources; and if allowable under current health orders, to be made available to SFUSD**
6 **Seniors for senior specific activities.**

8 WHEREAS, On March 16, 2020, Six Bay Area counties announced “shelter in place”
9 orders for all residents in an effort to slow the rapidly spreading coronavirus across the region
10 that included the closure of all schools; and

11 WHEREAS, San Francisco Unified School District remains in remote-learning while the
12 City’s two largest parochial high schools, Sacred Heart Cathedral Preparatory and St. Ignatius
13 Preparatory have resumed in-person classes for many of their students; and

14 WHEREAS, Majority of San Francisco’s private schools have begun to provide their
15 seniors with opportunities to take senior portraits, purchase announcements, class rings and
16 letterman jackets, etc.; and

17 WHEREAS, Many of the private schools are being proactive in planning senior events
18 like prom and graduation around the state and local guidelines; and

19 WHEREAS, This Resolution seeks to provide financial support and city resources to
20 San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD) Senior Class of 2021; now, therefore, be it

21 **RESOLVED**, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the Joint City, School
22 District, and City College Select Committee, the Mayor’s Office, Human Rights Commission,
23 Department of Children, Youth and Their Families, Department of Recreation and Parks,
24 Department of Public Health, San Francisco Unified School District Board, SFUSD Student
25 Advisory Board and Parent Advisory Council, to coordinate on the creation of an itemized list

1 of goods and activities that would support members of the SFUSD senior class of 2021, that
2 are allowable under current state and local public health guidelines, and that would require
3 funding; and, be it

4 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisor urges the Department of
5 Children, Youth, and Their Families, Human Rights Commission, Recreation and Parks
6 Department, and Department of Public Health to review their current capacity, infrastructure,
7 and funding, to determine whether or not they could support a City coordinated effort for the
8 SFUSD Senior Class of 2021; and, be it

9 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco values its students
10 and believes the SFUSD Senior Class of 2021 needs public funding and support to
11 adequately conclude their secondary education.

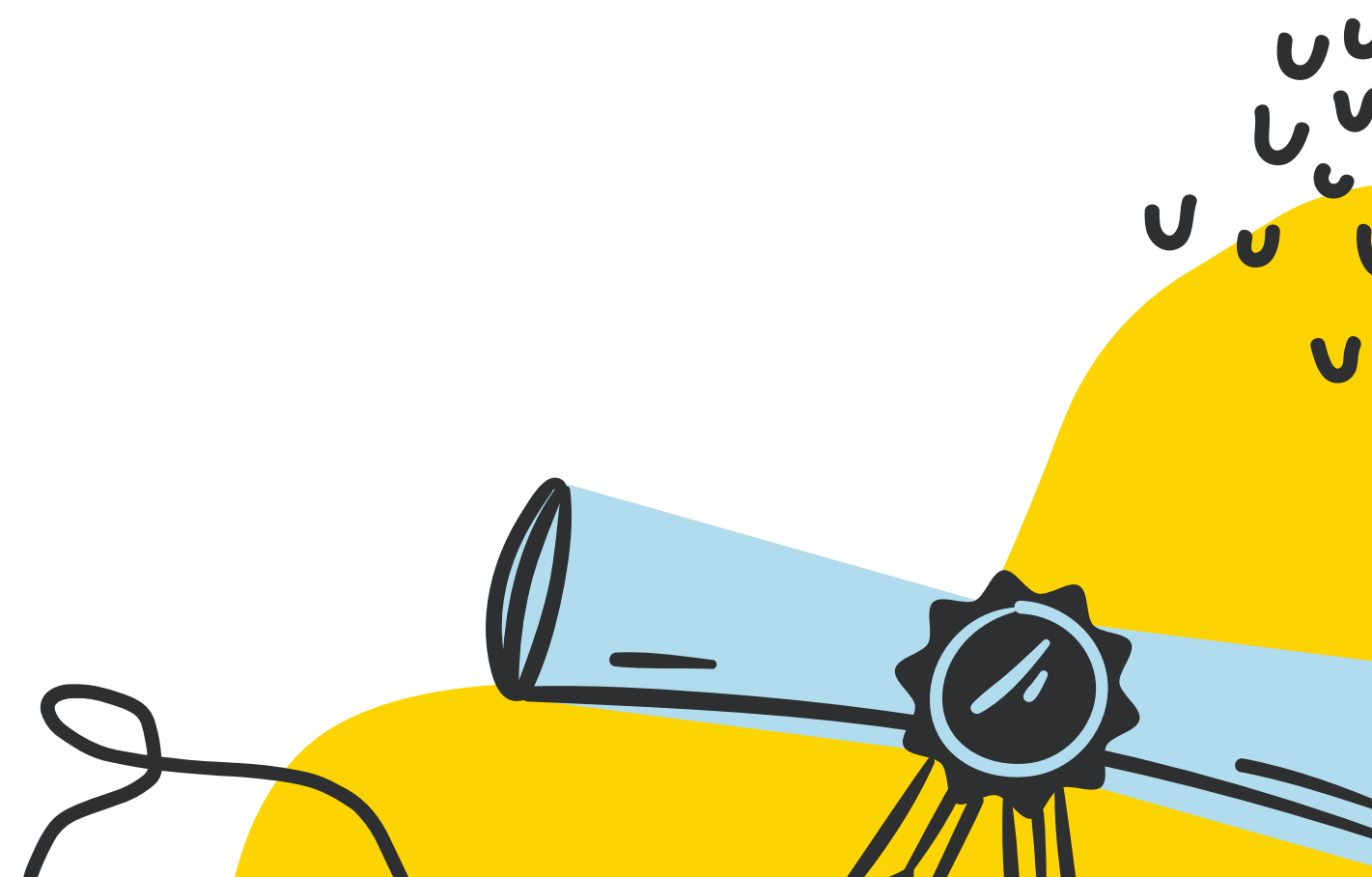


