[Supporting President Clinton's "Lands Legacy Initiative"] SUPPORTING PRESIDENT CLINTON'S "LANDS LEGACY INITIATIVE" AND URGING CONGRESS TO PASS.

WHEREAS, The Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) was established in 1964 to use federal revenues from offshore oil royalties to advance conservation efforts elsewhere, including acquisition of land for open space and recreation, or development of new recreational facilities; and,

WHEREAS, Royalties from the LWCF amount to about \$900 million a year; and, WHEREAS, The President has proposed a \$1 Billion "Lands Legacy Initiative", a 125 percent increase over FY 1999 funding; and

WHEREAS, This proposal would fully fund the LWCF for the first time in twenty (20) years; and

WHEREAS, This initiative represents the largest one-year investment, ever, in the preservation of America's lands legacy; and

WHEREAS, This initiative would provide significant new resources to states and local communities, forging a new conservation vision for the 21st Century; and

WHEREAS, All communities face a preservation challenge as they grow and green space shrinks; and

WHEREAS, Seven thousand acres of farmland and open space are lost each year; and

WHEREAS, This initiative will expand federal protection of critical lands across America, help states and communities preserve local green spaces, and strengthen protections for our oceans, coasts and farmlands; and

WHEREAS, Such an initiative would greatly benefit our overall quality of life and make countless communities more livable places for people; and

WHEREAS, on July 21, 1997, the people of the City and County of San Francisco, through the Board of Supervisors, endorsed *The Sustainability Plan of San Francisco*, on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 229-97-002, to "plan for their long-term well-being, and to ensure that the environment on which they and future generations rely is maintained; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, representing the people of the City and County of San Francisco, whole-heartedly and enthusiastically endorses and gives full support to the President's historic commitment to preserving and protecting local green spaces and forests, oceans and coasts, and endangered species and farmlands; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, representing the people of the City and County of San Francisco, urges representatives in Congress to pass the "Lands Legacy Initiative" when it comes before them for approval during the next session of Congress; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Resolution be sent to our Representatives in the House of Representatives, Nancy Pelosi and Tom Lantos, and in the Senate, Barbara Boxer and Dianne Feinstein.
