ESTABLISHING A CATASTROPHIC SICK LEAVE AND LONG-TERM DISABILITY TASK FORCE TO REVIEW ISSUES RELATED TO THE CITY'S CATASTROPHIC SICK LEAVE AND LONG TERM DISABILITY INSURANCE PROGRAMS FOR CITY EMPLOYEES AND TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS AND SETTING FORTH THE MEMBERSHIP AND DUTIES OF THE TASK FORCE.

WHEREAS, Since its inception, the TJ Anthony Catastrophic Sick Leave Program has provided an avenue for catastrophically-ill City employees to obtain donations of sick leave from other City employees, providing a vital safety net for City workers; and

WHEREAS, Commencing in 1997, several City employee bargaining units have negotiated for long term disability insurance, providing a similar safety net, and other bargaining units are expected to follow suit; and

WHEREAS, There have been several participants in the Catastrophic Sick Leave
Program who have participated in the program for years, relying on the program as a form of
long term disability coverage; and

WHEREAS, Several such participants have indicated that the longer they remain in the Catastrophic Sick Leave Program, the more difficult it is to obtain donations of hours; and

WHEREAS, Participants in the Catastrophic Sick Leave Program who are not actively working as of the date that long term disability insurance agreements are signed are not eligible for coverage; and

WHEREAS, These facts raise the questions as to whether modifications should be made to the Catastrophic Sick Leave Program; and

WHEREAS, At least one specific case has also raised the question as to whether City employees with catastrophically-ill dependents should be eligible to participate in the program; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby creates an advisory task force, called the Catastrophic Sick Leave and Long Term Disability Task Force, to review the Catastrophic Sick Leave and Long Term Disability Insurance programs and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors by May 1, 1999; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Task Force should address the following questions:

- -- Is the Catastrophic Sick Leave Program functioning well, particularly for long term participants?
 - -- How does the program integrate with the Long Term Disability Insurance Program?
- -- Should a donation pool be instituted for the Catastrophic Sick Leave Program instead of requiring donations from individual employee to individual employee?
- -- Are there rules that need to be instituted for the Catastrophic Sick Leave Program as bargaining units negotiate for Long Term Disability Insurance?
- -- For catastrophically-ill employees who are not currently working and are not eligible for long term disability insurance, what would be involved in establishing long-term disability equivalent benefits?
- -- Should the Catastrophic Sick Leave Program be expanded to provide coverage to City employees with catastrophically-ill dependents or domestic partners and how would this dovetail with Family Leave? and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall include one member appointed by the Mayor, one member appointed by the City Attorney, one member appointed by the Controller, one member appointed by the Director of Public Health, one member appointed by the Director of Human Resources, one member appointed by the Director of the Retirement

System, one member appointed by the Civil Service Commission and two members appointed by the President of the Board of Supervisors representing organizations with significant expertise in employee benefits issues.
