[Urging the Mayor to Return Transit Funding to the Municipal Transportation Agency]

Resolution urging Mayor Gavin Newsom to return to the Municipal Transportation Agency positions and funds that are not directly related to the operations of the Agency.

WHEREAS, The quality and performance of San Francisco's public transit system consistently ranks among citizens' greatest concerns; and,

WHEREAS, The Municipal Transportation Agency faces annual structural budget deficits greater than \$100 million; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco voters twice affirmed the importance of an independent agency in Propositions E of November 1999 and A of November 2007; and,

WHEREAS, As part of Proposition E of 1999, voters wrote into the city's charter our Transit First Policy which outlines the city's official commitment to offering safe, on-time public transportation for all city residents; and,

WHEREAS, The Transit First Policy further states "All officers, boards, commissions." and departments shall implement these principles in conducting the City and County's affairs"; and,

WHEREAS, Proposition E established the Municipal Transportation Fund as the operating account for the MTA and specified the appropriate uses of the fund as follows: "Monies therein shall be appropriated, expended, or used by the Agency solely and exclusively for the operation including, without limitation, capital improvements, management, supervision, maintenance, extension, and day-to-day operation of 1) the Agency; 2) the Municipal Railway; 3) upon its incorporation into the Agency, the Department of Parking and Traffic; and 4) any other division of the Agency subsequently created and performing

transportation-related functions. Monies in the Fund may not be used for any other purposes than those identified in this Section. (Charter Section 8A.105 (a))"; and,

WHEREAS, The Controller recently made public information regarding several senior staff and support staff hired into the Mayor's Office as MTA employees and funded through the Agency, identifying the cost of these positions in Fiscal Year 2007-08 as \$749,232; and,

WHEREAS, This practice of appropriating money and positions from the MTA to fund special assistants and support staff at the Mayor's Office violates may violate the budget provisions set forth in the above referenced Charter section; and,

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Proposition E, the MTA Board of Directors is charged with giving policy guidance to the Agency and overseeing the Agency's financial assets; now, therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Mayor to return positions and funds not directly related to the operations of the MTA; and be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board urges the Mayor reduce the use of transit related funds or positions in preparing the forthcoming FY 2008-09 Mayor's Office budget; and, be it,

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Mayor to collaborate with the MTA Board of Directors to develop and adopt criteria requiring all MTA work orders be accompanied by written specific explanations of the services provided to the MTA through such work orders.
