WHEREAS, the tobacco industry was successful in not requiring that the states invest tobacco settlement revenues in tobacco prevention; and

WHEREAS, Governor Davis vetoed legislation that would have required the tobacco settlement revenues go toward tobacco prevention and medical services, resulting in the settlement proceeds going into the General Fund; and

WHEREAS, despite decreasing revenue levels for Proposition 99-funded tobacco control programs, Governor Gray Davis' budget does not allocate any new funding to support California's integrated, comprehensive tobacco control program; and

WHEREAS, 82 percent of Californians believe the Governor and the state legislature should allocate annually at least 25 percent of the tobacco settlement funds to strengthen California's anti-tobacco education and prevention programs; and

WHEREAS, 84 percent of Californians believe money received from the state's tobacco settlement should be spent on programs to help people stop smoking and prevent young people from starting to smoke; and
