3 **Resolution determining that the issuance of a Type-57 special on-sale general**
4 **beer, wine, and distilled spirits liquor license to MG-SC, LLC, doing business as**
5 **Shack15, located at One Ferry Building, Suite 201 (District 3), will serve the public**
6 **convenience or necessity of the City and County of San Francisco; and**
7 **requesting that the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control impose**
8 **conditions on the issuance of the license.**

10 WHEREAS, MG-SC, LLC, is seeking the issuance of a Type-57 special on-sale
11 general beer, wine, and distilled spirits liquor license, and the issuance of a Type-86
12 instructional tasting license, to do business as Cask, located at 685 Market Street,
13 Suite B (District 6); and

14 WHEREAS, The Planning Department has verified that the area is properly
15 zoned and recommends approval; and

16 WHEREAS, The Police Department has filed zero protests and zero letters of
17 support with the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control under California Business
18 and Professions Code, Section 24013, and recommends that the Department of
19 Alcoholic Beverage Control issue the liquor license with conditions; and


20 WHEREAS, The conditions recommended by the Police Department are the
21 following: 1) Sales, service and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted
22 only between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 12:00 a.m. (midnight) each day of the week;
23 and 2) Petitioner(s) shall actively monitor the area under their control in an effort to
24 prevent the loitering of persons on any property adjacent to the licensed premises as
25 depicted on the most recently certified ABC-253; now, therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED, That in accordance with California Business and Professions Code,
2 Section 23958.4, the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
3 hereby determines that the issuance of a Type-57 special on-sale general beer, wine,
4 and distilled spirits liquor license to MG-SC, LLC, doing business as Shack15, located
5 at One Ferry Building, Suite 201, will serve the public convenience or necessity of the
6 City and County of San Francisco; and, be it

7 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of
8 San Francisco hereby endorses and adopts the recommendations of the Police
9 Department listed above and recommends that the Department of Alcoholic Beverage
10 Control issue the license with those conditions.

I represent Shack15. As you know, Shack15 has applied for a Type 57 ABC license so that it may serve alcohol in its premises on the upper floor of the Ferry Building. We understand that concerns may have been raised that Shack15 is operating a private club in its space in the Ferry Building since the Type 57 license is sometimes referred to as a "private club license". There have also been inaccurate media reports that The Mina Group was planning to open a private club in the Ferry Building.

Shack15 is well aware of the prohibition on non-maritime private clubs in the Ferry Building, as set forth in the Waterfront Land Use Plan and Proposition H of 1990 (codified in San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 61). Shack15 is not operating a private club in the Ferry Building. Shack15 is an office co-working business and uses its space in the Ferry Building as an office use. Shack15 has retained The Mina Group to manage the food and beverage services (currently a café) available to users of Shack15's space in the Ferry Building.

At Shack15's Ferry Building location, anyone who is interested in renting co-working space is welcome, and, although the co-working space application form on Shack15's website requests two "references", providing references is optional. We will not reject anyone for being unable to supply a reference. In fact, Shack15's co-working fees for its flex-space are significantly lower than those of almost all of its competitors, making Shack15 more accessible to the general public than its competitors. In addition, Shack15 offers day-use passes for those who need office co-working space on a limited basis. Please visit www.shack15.com/visit for more information on using the co-working space. As an office co-working space, Shack15's use is actually more open than the space was during its previous use as a law firm.

In addition, Shack15 has provided use of its Ferry Building space at reduced rates or no-charge to non-profits, philanthropic ventures, civic groups, artists, and start-ups, including the Exploratorium, Jara, Illuminate, Immersive Arts Alliance, and Global Shapers Community.



Shack15 also hosts events in its space in the Ferry Building that are open to the public. These include everything from Book Passage author visits and MINDBODY wellness classes, to talks covering a wide range of subjects – sustainability, work place diversity, and the arts. Shack15's events are posted on its website and anyone with an account on Eventbrite can register for upcoming events in Shack15's space. Please visit www.shack15.com/events for more information. Shack15's philosophy is to cultivate events, through local and community partnerships, that offer value to San Francisco and the greater Bay Area. With spaces constantly closing, Shack15 offers a special place for community-based organizations and civic-minded groups to convene, and is actively reaching out to new civic groups to invite them to utilize the space.

Nevertheless, first and foremost, Shack15 is an office co-working space that is committed to providing a well-appointed, productive and convenient office co-working environment to individuals and companies. The Type 57 ABC license that Shack15 is seeking is the correct type of license for the co-working use, as it does not require food service and allows minors to be present on the premises.

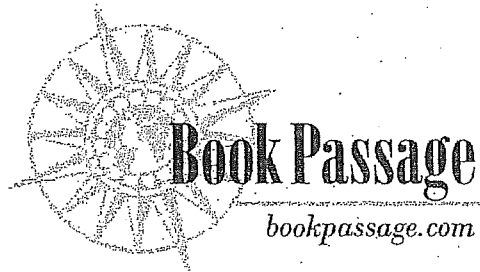



It has the potential to save millions of lives in under-resourced countries and disaster zones. Having designed my life to serve the mission of my organization, I am living and working in San Francisco for the sole purpose of finding the best talent and obtaining the best launch trajectory for our product. Often, I struggle. 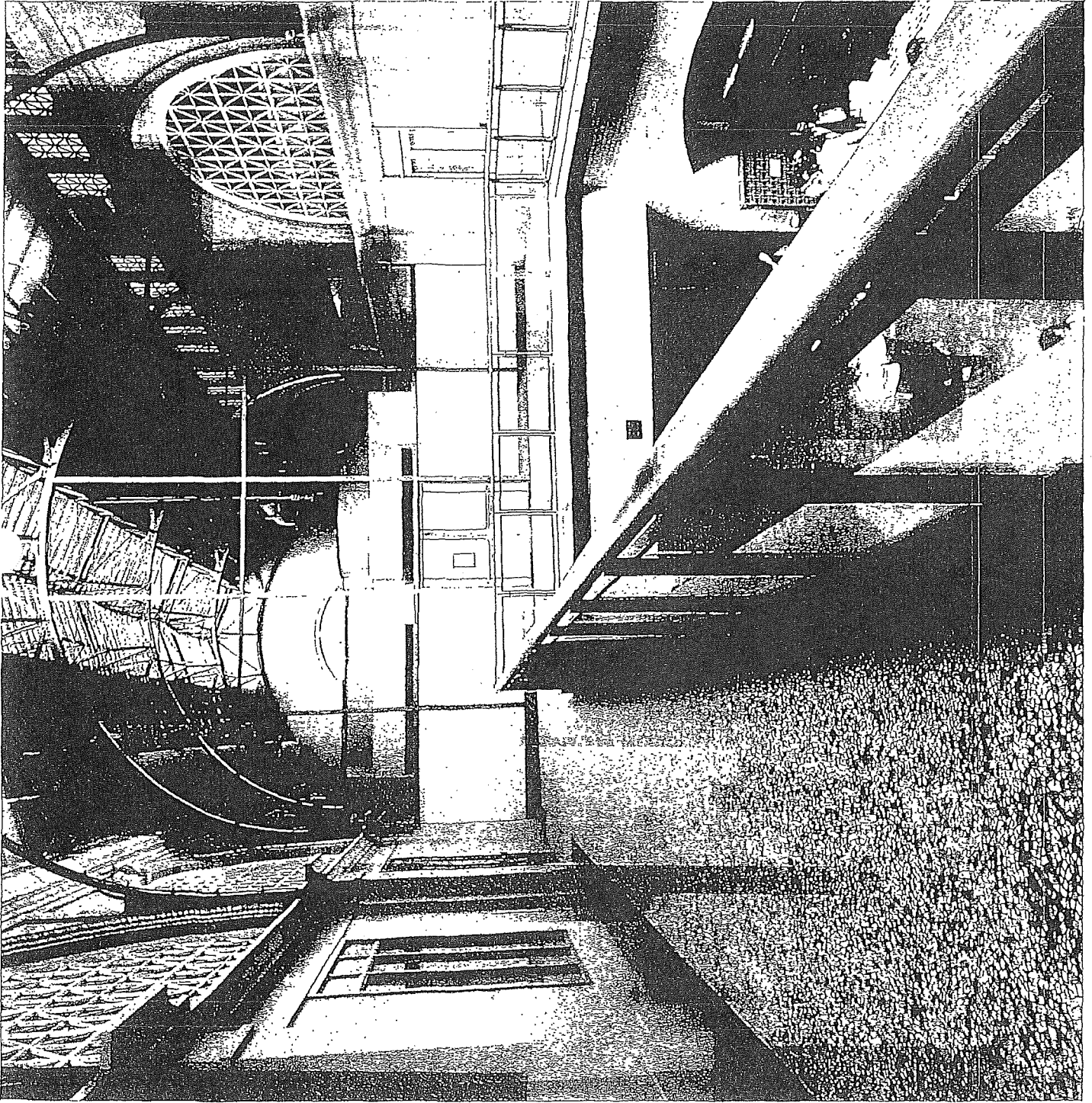

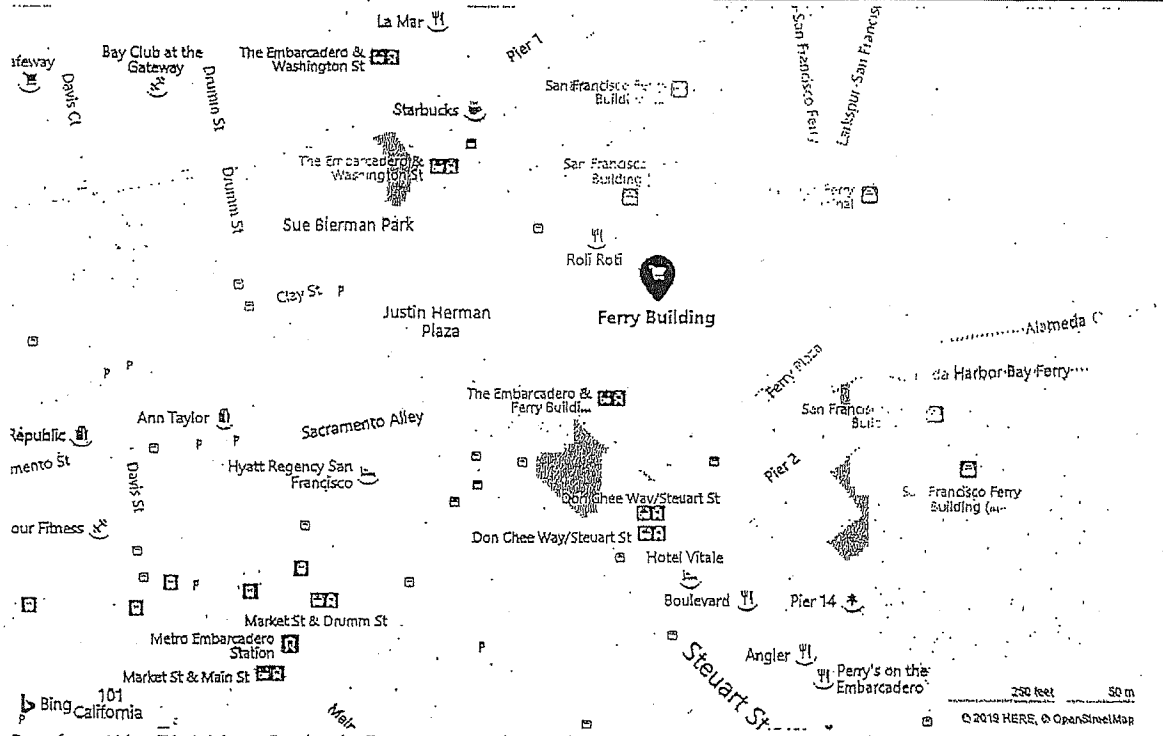
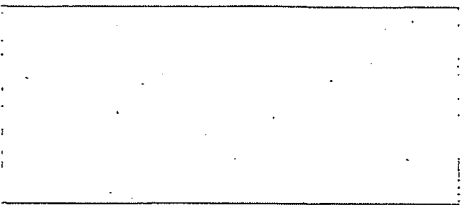

Award-winning Norwegian barista Tim Wendelboe will also develop a one-of-a-kind coffee program to ensure that the Shack15's culinary offerings are unparalleled, from start to finish.

The premises is highly unique in that Shack15 will serve specialty Scandinavian-inspired cuisine in an upscale environment overlooking the San Francisco Bay that no other restaurant in the vicinity can match. Shack15 will offer varied priced meals for breakfast, lunch and dinner for its members and their guests who seek to enhance their professional and social gatherings with excellent seasonal fare served in an unprecedented Nordic-San Francisco setting. The proposed operations will be in

complete harmony with other commercial businesses located in the building and in the area. Beer, wine and spirits sales and service will be incidental to Shack15's operations, but will enhance the amenities that contribute to the unique platform we will be providing to foster local and global entrepreneurship. Shack15 will employ numerous local residents, including but not limited to individuals trained through the City and County of San Francisco's First Source Hiring Program, and the company's operations will contribute to the local economy and add to state and local tax revenues. Shack15 will abide by all laws, including those related to the sale and service of alcoholic beverages.


