

1 [Accept - Expend State Grant]
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3 **Resolution authorizing the Mayor’s Office of Criminal Justice (MOCJ) to accept and**
4 **expend funds in the amount of \$2,634,179 from the State Board of Corrections, from**
5 **funds made available under Assembly Bill 1913 – known as the Schiff-Cardenas Crime**
6 **Prevention Act of 2000 (CPA 2000), for programs and approaches that have been**
7 **demonstrated to be effective in reducing delinquency.**

8 WHEREAS, MOCJ is the lead programmatic and fiscal agency of the county in
9 administering CPA 2000, which provides funds for the county to implement a comprehensive
10 multi-agency juvenile justice plan; and

11 WHEREAS, CPA 2000 requires that the county’s local juvenile justice coordinating
12 council, whose membership is described in Section 749.22 of the Welfare and Institutions
13 Code, update its Juvenile Justice Local Action Plan and develop an annual expenditure plan
14 for CPA 2000; and

15 WHEREAS, CPA 2000 also requires that the county Board of Supervisors, and in the
16 case of a city and county the Mayor, approve the updated juvenile justice local action plan and
17 the CPA 2000 expenditure plan; and

18 WHEREAS, the City originally established the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council
19 through resolution 170-97; and

20 WHEREAS, the Chief Probation Officer, Jesse Williams, as required by CPA 2000 and
21 Section 749.22 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, serves as the chair of the Juvenile
22 Justice Coordinating Council; and

23 WHEREAS, on March 27, 2003 the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council, chaired by
24 the Chief Probation Officer, met and recommended to the Board of Supervisors the updated
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1 local action plan and the expenditure plan for the 2003 allocation of the CPA 2000 grant; and

2 WHEREAS, all funds provided through CPA 2000 are for direct services to youth, it is
3 requested that indirect costs be waived; therefore, be it

4 RESOLVED, that the City and County of San Francisco hereby authorizes MOCJ to
5 accept and expend \$2,634,179 from the State Board of Corrections, under CPA 2000 for
6 programs and approaches that have been demonstrated to be effective in reducing
7 delinquency; and

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9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, all interest earned and prior year unexpended
10 encumbered funds of this grant is appropriated to support approved 2003 CPA programs; and

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County assures that the Board of Supervisors
12 has reviewed and approves the county's update to the Comprehensive Multi-agency Juvenile
13 Justice Plan dated March 2003; and

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of the Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice
15 is authorized to sign the application for approval submitted to the Board of Corrections; and

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of San Francisco assures that it
17 has adhered to the requirements of CPA 2000 and of the Board of Corrections regarding the
18 submission of the plan; and

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the plan has been developed and provided to the
20 Board of Corrections in a format determined by the Board of Corrections regarding
21 submission of the Plan; and

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of San Francisco, upon
23 approval from the Board of Corrections, will adhere to the requirements of the CPA 2000
24 regarding the expenditure of CPA 2000 funds and the submission of required Board of
25 Corrections reports.
