20	through resolution 170-97; and	
21	WHEREAS, the Chief Probation Officer, Jesse Williams, as required by CPA 2000 and	
22	Section 749.22 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, serves as the chair of the Juvenile	
2324	Justice Coordinating Council; and	
25	WHEREAS, on March 27, 2003 the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council, chaired by

	the Chief Probation Officer, met and recommended to the Board of Supervisors the updated	

local action plan and the expenditure plan for the 2003 allocation of the CPA 2000 grant; and WHEREAS, all funds provided through CPA 2000 are for direct services to youth, it is requested that indirect costs be waived; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the City and County of San Francisco hereby authorizes MOCJ to accept and expend \$2,634,179 from the State Board of Corrections, under CPA 2000 for programs and approaches that have been demonstrated to be effective in reducing delinquency; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, all interest earned and prior year unexpended encumbered funds of this grant is appropriated to support approved 2003 CPA programs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County assures that the Board of Supervisors has reviewed and approves the county's update to the Comprehensive Multi-agency Juvenile Justice Plan dated March 2003; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of the Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice is authorized to sign the application for approval submitted to the Board of Corrections; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of San Francisco assures that it has adhered to the requirements of CPA 2000 and of the Board of Corrections regarding the submission of the plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the plan has been developed and provided to the Board of Corrections in a format determined by the Board of Corrections regarding submission of the Plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of San Francisco, upon approval from the Board of Corrections, will adhere to the requirements of the CPA 2000 regarding the expenditure of CPA 2000 funds and the submission of required Board of Corrections reports.
