Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to provide a Street Light Policy; and to make relevant findings.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Environmental Findings. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 140981 and is incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Section 98.3, to read as follows:

SEC. 98.3. SAN FRANCISCO STREET LIGHT POLICY

- (a) The San Francisco Board of Supervisors finds that:
- (1) Quality street lighting helps define a positive urban character and supports nighttime activities.
- (2) Nighttime lighting is critical for both traffic safety and pedestrian safety and security.
- (3) Functioning street lights are essential for maintaining high quality of life, public safety, and economic activity in San Francisco.
- (4) Roadway and pedestrian levellighting are both important aspects of street lighting responsibilities.

1	(B) Further integrating the private utility's street light maintenance		
2	operations into the City 311 system, and including more detailed and timely reporting of		
3	<u>completed repairs;</u>		
4	(C) Integrating up to date street light infrastructure information into		
5	the existing City GIS database by December 1, 2014, and developing pedestrian scale lighting		
6	standards by December 1, 2014;		
7	(D) Establishing a uniform, shared standard for levels of service for		
8	the repairs of all street lights, such that simple outages should be corrected within 48 hours of		
9	being reported; and		
10	(E) Whenever a street light is repaired or replaced, repairing or		
11	replacing such street light should be in accordance with the Street Light Policy.		
12	(4) That the City shall strive to unify streetlight management under a		
13	municipal program.		
14	(c) All public and private entities operating and maintaining street lights in the City shall		
15	provide an annual report to the Board of Supervisors documenting their efforts to manage street		
16	lighting in a manner consistent with the Street Light Policy.		
17	Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after		
18	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the		
19	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board		
20	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - Street Light Policy]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to provide a Street Light Policy, and to make relevant findings

Existing Law

The proposed ordinance would amend Administrative Code to provide a City wide unified Street Light Policy.

Amendments to Current Law

The Ordinance would adopt a Citywide Street Light Policy. In furtherance of the policy, lighting should be designed not only for vehicular traffic, but also for pedestrians on sidewalks and pedestrian paths. Whenever at least 50% of the lighting along an existing street is upgraded, or lighting along a new street is added, adequate pedestrian scale lighting should be evaluated and included as appropriate.

Further, the Policy urges management of street lights and coordination with San Francisco's private street light utility to more effectively provide, maintain, and repair the City's street lights; to transition to light-emitting diode (LED) technology; to further integrate the private utility's street light maintenance operations into the City 311 system; to create more detailed and timely reporting of completed repairs; to integrate up to date street light infrastructure information into the existing City GIS database by December 1, 2014; to develop pedestrian scale lighting standards by December 1, 2014; and to establish a uniform, shared standard for levels of service for the repairs of all street lights facilitating correction of outages within 48 hours of being reported. The Policy further provides that the City should strive to unify streetlight management under a municipal program.

Background Information

Pursuant to the Charter, the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission has exclusive jurisdiction and control over providing City-owned street lighting. Currently, ownership and maintenance responsibility of the City's streetlights is divided between the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission and a private utility. The proposed Street Light Policy urges more effective coordination of street light activities and functions and the creation of a single, municipally-managed unified streetlight program.
