## CHARTER AMENDMENT

## PROPOSITION \_\_\_\_\_

Describing and setting forth a proposal to the qualified voters of the City and County of San Francisco to amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco by adding Section 9.119 to limit the expenditure of one-time revenues to one-time uses, unless the Board of Supervisors waives the limitation for a specific expenditure by a two-thirds' vote, and setting an operative date and an expiration date.

The Board of Supervisors hereby submits to the qualified voters of the City and County, at an election to be held on June 2, 2009, a proposal to amend the Charter of the City and County by adding Section 9.119 to read as follows:

Section 1. The San Francisco Charter is hereby amended by adding Section 9.119, to read as follows:

## SEC. 9.119. ONE-TIME REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES.

(a) The Controller shall identify and certify all one-time revenues proposed in the Mayor's budget. For purposes of this Section, one-time revenues are revenues earned or accrued after the effective date of this Section and attributable to "extraordinary items" or "special items," as those terms are used under generally accepted accounting principles applicable to state and local governmental entities. "Extraordinary items" and "special items" are events that are unusual in nature and/or infrequent in occurrence. Surplus collections that are not estimated to recur in subsequent years are one-time revenues for purposes of this Section. Prior year fund balances, reserves, or proceeds from the sale of bonds are not one-time

Supervisor Elsbernd BOARD OF SUPERVISORS revenues for purposes of this Section. The Controller shall set aside to be used only for one-time purposes any one-time revenues received during the year that exceed the one-time revenues anticipated in the budget.

(b) The City may expend one-time revenues only for one-time uses and only upon the certification by the Controller that the proposed appropriation is for a one-time use, except where the Board of Supervisors by a two-thirds' vote appropriates all or part of the one-time revenues for specific ongoing or operational expenses. Nothing in this Section shall be construed to prevent the deposit of one-time revenues in the Rainy Day Reserve or other reserves, or to limit the City's ability to accept or comply with the terms of a grant.

(c) This Section shall become operative on July 1, 2010, and shall expire by operation of law on June 30, 2020, unless the Board of Supervisors by resolution extends the operation of this Section for any period that may not extend beyond June 30, 2025. This Section shall expire on June 30, 2025. Thereafter, the City Attorney shall cause the Section to be deleted from future editions of the Charter.
