14	enter into an agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the		
15	Board of Supervisors in File No, which is hereby declared to be a part of		
16	this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,		
17	WHEREAS, The grant budget includes provision for indirect costs of \$4,142; now,		
18	therefore, be it		
19	RESOLVED, That SFDPH is hereby authorized to accept retroactively and expend a		
20	grant in the amount of \$50,548 from CDHS; and, be it		
21	FURTHER RESOLVED, That SFDPH is hereby authorized to accept and expend the		
22	grant funds in accordance with the requirements set forth in the Agreement pursuant to San		
23	Francisco Administrative Code section 10-170-1; and, be it		
24	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the		
25	agreement on behalf of the City; and, be it
