[Concurring in the Continuation of the Declaration of Local Emergency - Flooding Affecting SFPUC's Moccasin Reservoir (Tuolumne County)]

Motion concurring in the continuation of the Declaration of Local Emergency by the Mayor and in the actions taken to meet the emergency of flooding affecting the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission's Moccasin Reservoir in Tuolumne County.

WHEREAS, On March 29, 2018, Mayor Mark E. Farrell declared a local emergency to exist, under Charter, Section 3.100(14) and California Government Code, Section 8630, in connection with flooding caused by a high intensity rain storm on March 22, 2018, in the vicinity of the town of Moccasin in Tuolumne County causing a large flow of water and debris from Moccasin Creek to enter the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission's (SFPUC) Moccasin Reservoir, flooding nearby areas and causing damage to SFPUC property including Moccasin Dam and appurtenant structures and systems; and

WHEREAS, Moccasin Reservoir is a critical part of the SFPUC's Regional Water System because it provides operational response time in case of disruptions to the water and power system upstream of the Reservoir, re-regulation of flows and pressures within the system downstream of Moccasin Reservoir, and turbidity control; and

WHEREAS, On April 3, 2018, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the Mayor's Declaration of Local Emergency by Motion No. M18-41, on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 180293, which is hereby declared to be a part of this Motion, as if set forth fully herein; and

WHEREAS, Government Code, Section 8630 provides that, when a local emergency has been declared, the governing body shall review the need for continuing the local emergency at least once every 30 days until it is terminated by the Mayor or the Board of Supervisors;

WHEREAS, On April 16, 2018, the Mayor transmitted a copy of the continued Declaration of Local Emergency to the Board of Supervisors, in which he requested that this Board calendar a monthly occurring item on the Board's agenda to continue the emergency through July 2018, and such copy is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 180649; and

WHEREAS, On April 24, 2018, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the continuation of the Declaration of Local Emergency by Motion No. M18-63, on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 180402, which is hereby declared to be a part of this Motion, as if set forth fully herein; and

WHEREAS, On May 22, 2018, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the continuation of the Declaration of Local Emergency by Motion No. M18-77, on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 180539, which is hereby declared to be a part of this Motion, as if set forth fully herein; and

WHERAS, On June 19, 2018, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the continuation of the Declaration of Local Emergency by Motion No. M18-92, on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 180649, which is hereby declared to be a part of this Motion, as if set forth fully herein; and

WHEREAS, The March 22 flooding has impacted the water delivery conveyance capability from the Hetch Hetchy system to the SFPUC's Regional Water system as Moccasin Reservoir has remained out of service until necessary repairs and interim improvements can be scoped, designed and constructed, and SFPUC staff is working closely with the California Division of Safety of Dams regarding the scope of repairs and improvements necessary to restore the dam and reservoir to a restricted level of service before winter; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor has directed the head of each department and agency to observe his or her proper relationship in the command structure of the Incident Command

System, and be responsive to the orders and requests of the Lead Department designated to exercise supervision over his or her department during the course of this emergency; and

WHEREAS, The Governor of the State of California is hereby requested to include the area of the City and County of San Francisco in any emergency declaration by the State, and is further requested to ensure that the City and County of San Francisco is included in any emergency declaration that may be issued by the President of the United States; and

WHEREAS, All departments of the City and County of San Francisco are strictly enjoined to cooperate with the requests for material and personnel resources by the Incident Command System staff of said City and County which is located in the Emergency Operations Center of the City and County of San Francisco; now, therefore, be it

MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors concurs with the continuation of the Declaration of Local Emergency issued by Mayor Mark E. Farrell on April 16, 2018, and in the actions taken to meet the emergency, including but not limited to the SFPUC's execution of contracts cumulatively totalling not more than \$25,000,000 to perform emergency repairs and improvements to the Moccasin Reservoir main dam structure, spillways, diversion dam, and other appurtenant structures in order to be able to seek approval from the California Division of Safety of Dams to restore the dam and reservoir to a restricted level of service prior to the commencement of the rainy season in October 2018.

Dear Ms. Calvillo,

On March 29, 2018, I issued a Declaration of Local Emergency due to conditions of extreme peril to property due to flooding that began on March 22, 2018 at Hetch Hetchy Water and Power, located in the town on Moccasin in Tuolumne County.

Our Office, DEM, SFPUC, OCA, Controller's office, and the City Attorney's Office has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to continue the Declaration of Local Emergency related to the Moccasin Dam and Reservoir for the coming months. The SFPUC, working in coordination with the California Division of Safety of Dams, is still assessing the extensive damage to City assets in the area, and is seeking flexibility to rapidly hire contractors to repair damage before this year's snow and storm season arrives in October.

Under state law, the local emergency must be renewed every 30 days by the Board of Supervisors, or else it expires. Based on City Attorney advice, SFPUC has asked us to seek a monthly recurring item on the BOS agenda to continue the emergency. We request that a monthly occurring item occur on the following days:

- April 24
- May 22
- June 19
- July 17
