The Board of Supervisors' Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee has received the following resolution request, introduced by Supervisor Stephen Sherrill on June 3, 2025. This item is being referred for comment and recommendation.

[Prioritize Emergency Response to Drug Activity Near Parks, Playgrounds, and Schools]

Resolution urging the Police Department and the Department of Emergency Management to designate all 911 calls reporting drug use or suspected drug activity within 1,500 feet of parks, playgrounds, and schools as "Priority A" calls requiring swift and immediate response.

8	WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has a responsibility to protect the		
9	health, safety, and welfare of all residents, especially children, families, and vulnerable		
10	populations who frequent parks, playgrounds, and schools; and		
11	WHEREAS, The ongoing public health crisis involving the open use and trafficking of		
12	illicit drugs in public spaces has raised significant concern among residents, educators,		
13	parents, and community leaders; and		
14	WHEREAS, Parks, playgrounds, and schools are essential public spaces that provide		
15	opportunities for recreation, education, and healthy development, and these public spaces		
16	must be protected as safe and drug-free zone; and		
17	WHEREAS, Numerous incidents of drug use and drug-related activity have been		
18	reported near playgrounds and schools, in some cases resulting in life-threatening situations		
19	involving children; and		
20	WHEREAS, Exposure to drug use or paraphernalia poses serious risks to the physica		
21	and emotional health of children, undermining the safety and integrity of surrounding		
22	neighborhoods; and		
23	WHEREAS, Numerous incidents of drug use and drug-related activity have been		
24	reported in close proximity to these sensitive community sites, threatening the public safety,		
25	livability, and integrity of neighborhoods throughout San Francisco; and		

1	WHEREAS, The Police Department and the Department of Emergency Management			
2	categorize 911 calls into priority levels based on urgency where "Priority A" calls involve			
3	serious crimes in progress, threats to life or public safety, or situations requiring immediate			
4	police intervention; and			
5	WHEREAS, Calls to 911 reporting drug use or related activity near schools and parks			
6	are not consistently treated as Priority A, resulting in delayed responses that can place			
7	vulnerable populations at increased risk; and			
8	WHEREAS, The Department of Emergency Management, in coordination with the			
9	Police Department, determines call prioritization, and this categorization directly impacts the			
10	speed and level of response residents receive; now, therefore, be it			
11	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco			
12	urges the Police Department and the Department of Emergency Management to immediately			
13	revise their dispatch protocols to classify all 911 calls reporting drug use, visible narcotics			
14	activity, or suspected drug trafficking within 1,500 feet of any park, playground, or school as			
15	"Priority A" calls; and, be it			
16	FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Resolution does not change existing criminal justice			
17	policies or laws, but affirms the City's duty to ensure public safety and calls for operational			
18	prioritization of these calls; and, be it			
19	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors requests the Police Departmen			
20	and Department of Emergency Management send a report to the Board within 60 days of the			
21	passage of this Resolution on implementation steps taken and any additional resources			
22	needed to fully effectuate this change; and, be it			
23	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall transmit			
24	copies of this Resolution to the Police Department and Department of Emergency			

Management for immediate consideration and action.
