Hi Linda,

The Naloxone Distribution Project is funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and administered by the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS). With the on-going opioid health crisis, we have had to resubmit for additional units of Naloxone because of need and delayed our request of request to incorporate the revised requests. The resolution is retroactive because DHCS ships the naloxone units to the recipient as soon as the application is reviewed and approved and we have received the units and it has been put into use. It doesn't provide us enough time to go through the Accept & Expend Resolution process, which takes several months (we need to work with Controller's Office and Mayor's Office, then it has to be approved by our Police Commission, Budget Finance Committee, and the Board).

From DataSF stats, we have had at least 501 incidents that involve an aided case of naloxone deployment.
