11	Section 1. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by adding Section				
12 13	3055.2, to read as follows:				
14	Sec. 3055.2. Public Right to Know Private Property Towing Laws.				
15	<u>(a)</u>	Findings. Th	ne Board of Supervisors finds:		
16	<u>(i)</u>	that there are	e frequent incidents of illegal towing from private property in San		
17	Francisco; and				
18	<u>(ii)</u>	that there is	a significant risk to the safety of residents and visitors when illegal towing		
19	from private property occurs at night; and				
20	(iii)	that there is a	a risk to public health and safety when the vehicles of senior citizens and		
21	persons with disabilities are illegally towed from private property; and				
22	<u>(iv)</u>	that illegal to	owing from private property affects vulnerable populations when people of		
23	limited economic means are required to pay hundreds of dollars to recover their vehicle, or are				
24	subjected to deficiency claims by collection agencies if they could not afford to pick up their vehicle				
25	even when the vehicle was illegally towed; and				

1	<u>(v)</u>	that the rights of vehicle owners when their vehicle is towed from private property, as
2	described in th	he California Vehicle Code, are extremely difficult for a citizens and visitors to find and
3	understand, es	specially for non-English speakers or those who speak English as a foreign language; and
4	<u>(vi)</u>	that there are no accessible resources for people to research their rights and
5	<u>responsibilitie</u>	s with respect to private property tows; and
6	<u>(vii)</u>	that requiring tow car firms to provide information on the legal rights of vehicle owners
7	at the time the	y reclaim their vehicle would be an effective way of informing vehicle owners of their
8	rights under C	California law when their vehicle is towed from private property; and
9	<u>(viii)</u>	that preventing illegal conduct by tow car operators when towing from private property
10	would reduce	the economic burden on residents and visitors by eliminating the need to go to small
11	<u>claims court a</u>	fter a vehicle owner has already paid to reclaim the vehicle; and
12	<u>(ix)</u>	that consistent adherence to legal towing practices will substantially increase the quality
13	of life for resi	dents and the experience of visitors to San Francisco.
14	<u>(b)</u>	Definitions. For the purposes of this Article, "Brochure" shall mean a concise summary
15	<u>of California l</u>	aw, including the maximum rate that can be legally charged for a private property tow
16	and the rights	and responsibilities of all parties who participate in towing from private property: real
17	property owne	ers, vehicle owners, tow car operators and tow car firms.
18	<u>(c)</u>	Duties of tow car firm permittees. Every towing firm, or person to whom or for whom a
19	permit to oper	rate a tow car firm has been granted pursuant to the provisions of this Article shall
20	display the Br	ochure in Chinese, Spanish and English in a conspicuous place in the location where a
21	vehicle owner	must come to reclaim their towed vehicle so that the Brochure may be easily seen by any
22	person who is	reclaiming their vehicle. A vehicle owner reclaiming their vehicle must also be able to
23	take a copy of	the brochure in any language without assistance from any employee of the tow car firm

2	the brochure in each language on the premises at all times.					
3	<u>(d)</u>	Duties of the Police Department. The Police Department shall:				
4	<u>(i)</u>	Develop the Brochure within 30 days of the effective date of this ordinance; and				
5	<u>(i)</u>	Arrange for translation of the Brochure into Chinese and Spanish; and				
6	<u>(ii)</u>	With the assistance of the City Attorney's Office, review the Brochure after July 1 of				
7	each year, and	and revise any provisions that are changed by state legislation or changes in public towing				
8	contract price	contract prices; and				
9	<u>(iii)</u>	Arrange for production of the Brochure in sufficient quantities for all tow car firm				
10	permittees and	d any City department that wishes to display the Brochure; and				
11	<u>(iv)</u>	Provide copies of the Brochure and display stands that are adequate to display the				
12	Brochure in a	ll of the required languages to any tow car firm permittee in sufficient quantities to				
13	ensure the tow	v car firm's compliance with this Section, and to City departments upon request; and				
14	<u>(v)</u>	Post the Brochure, contact information for the San Francisco Small Claims Court and				
15	the District At	ttorney's Office Consumer Protection Unit, and a list of current tow car firm permittees				
16	on the Police	Department's website.				
17	<u>(e)</u>	Funding. All costs of production, translation and distribution of the Brochure and				
18	display stands	s shall be recovered by the Police Department from the permit fees assessed for tow car				
19	firm and tow o	car operator permits, and from fines assessed pursuant to subsection (f) below.				
20	<u>(f)</u>	Violation. It shall be unlawful for a tow car firm to fail to meet the				
21	requirements	s of subsection (c) above. The penalty for a violation shall be \$500, and the				
22	proceeds of	penalties assessed against tow car firms under this Section shall be applied to				
23	offset the Po	lice Department's costs of implementing subsection (d) of this Section.
