URGING THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE U.S. CONGRESS TO CONSISTENTLY APPLY THE PRINCIPLE OF HUMAN RIGHTS AND TO AID IN THE REBUILDING OF SIERRA LEONE.

WHEREAS, The Sierra Leone Civil War was amongst this decade's most bloodiest conflicts; and,

WHEREAS, While NATO waged war to liberate Kosovo and to defend human rights there, the atrocities simultaneously being committed in Sierra Leone went largely unnoticed by the international community and include thousands of victims of brutality who have had their limbs, including lips, noses, arms, legs and feet, amputated, an untold number murdered and a refugee population of approximately 600,000; and,

WHEREAS, A \$1.5 billion aid package was recently announce at the G8 summit for Kosovo, there has been no such similar package announced for Sierra Leone; and,

WHEREAS, An infusion of international aid also presupposes Sierra Leone's ability to recover from the horrors and devastation of its civil war; and,

WHEREAS, The United States should defend and advance the principle of human rights consistently without regard to ethnicity, culture, race, religion and geography; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the President of the United States and the U.S. Congress to consistently apply the principle of human rights and in particular to aid in the rebuilding of Sierra Leone.
