2	Resolution urging the President of the United States of America to take actions
3	necessary to guarantee the awarding of full American citizenship to every man and
4	woman serving in the United States Armed Forces in the War in Iraq or upon their
5	favorable discharge from the Armed Forces.
6	
7	WHEREAS, Lance Corporal Jose Guiterrez was one of the first two American soldiers
8	killed in the war in Iraq on March 21, 2003; and,
9	WHEREAS, Posthumously, Jose Guiterrez was granted full American Citizenship for
10	his courage and bravery to defend the freedoms of the United States and similar rights of
11	freedom for all people worldwide; and,
12	WHEREAS, Our Armed Forces are made up of many fine men and women who are
13	not fully naturalized citizens of the Unites States; and,
14	WHEREAS, The United States of America should recognize the courage of those
15	individuals that step into the line of fire on behalf of America by awarding them full citizenship;
16	and,
17	WHEREAS, At the funeral of Lance Corporal Guiterrez, Cardinal Roger Mahoney
18 19	announced that he had forwarded a letter to the President of the United States urging him to
20	provided full citizenship for those serving in the War in Iraq or who are favorably discharged
21	from the Armed Forces; and,
22	WHEREAS, Cardinal Mahoney's letters stated " there is something terribly wrong
23	with our immigration policies if it takes death on the battlefield to earn citizenship;" and,

2	should not have to wait until they are dead and brought home in a casket to give them the
3	citizenship they deserve;" now, therefore, be it

5	urges the President of the United States of America to take actions necessary to guarantee
6	the awarding of full American citizenship to every man and woman serving in the United
7	States Armed Forces in the War in Iraq or upon their favorable discharge from the Armed
