10	Sectio	Section 1. Findings.			
11	A.	The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this			
12	Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public				
13	Resources Code sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the				
14	Board of Supervisors in File No and is incorporated herein by reference.				
15	Section 2. The San Francisco Health Code is hereby amended by amending Section				
16	1191 to read as follows:				
17	SEC.	1191. FEES AND CHARGES			
18	(a)	In accordance with the single fee system established pursuant to Health and			
19		Safety Code Section 25404.5, stationary sources required under this Article to			
20		submit an RMP shall pay the following fees and charges:			
21	(1)	RMP Review and Processing Fees. A stationary source that is notified that it			
22		must submit an RMP shall pay the following one-time fee to cover the cost of			
23		submission review and processing. This fee shall be due at the time the			
24		stationary source is notified that it must prepare an RMP:

1	(A)	Program 1 facilities: \$1044 for fiscal year 2004 (beginning July 1, 2004), \$1103 for
2		fiscal year 2005 (beginning July 1, 2005), \$1166 for fiscal year 2006 (beginning July 1,
3		2006) <u>\$1266</u> ;
4	(B)	Program 2 or 3 facilities: \$6136 for fiscal year 2004 (beginning July 1, 2004), \$6480
5		for fiscal year 2005 (beginning July 1, 2005), \$6849 for fiscal year 2006 (beginning July
6		1, 2006) \$7436;
7	(2)	Annual Fee for Stationary Sources. A stationary source that is required to
8		prepare and maintain an RMP shall pay the following annual fee, due at the first
9		billing cycle after the RMP is considered complete by the Director, and annually
10		thereafter:
11	(A)	Program 1 facilities: \$148 for fiscal year 2004 (beginning July 1, 2004), \$156 for fiscal
12		year 2005 (beginning July 1, 2005), \$165 for fiscal year 2006 (beginning July 1, 2006)
13		<u>\$180;</u>
14	(B)	Program 2 or 3 facilities: \$296 for fiscal year 2004 (beginning July 1, 2004), \$313 for
15		fiscal year 2005 (beginning July 1, 2005), \$330 for fiscal year 2006 (beginning July 1,
16		2006) \$358.
17	(b)	Beginning with fiscal year 2007-2008, no later than April 15 of each year, the
18		Controller shall adjust the fees provided in this Article to reflect changes in the
19		relevant Consumer Price Index, without further action by the Board of
20		Supervisors. In adjusting the fees, the Controller may round these fees up or
21		down to the nearest dollar, half-dollar or quarter-dollar. The Director shall
22		perform an annual review of the fees scheduled to be assessed for the following
23		fiscal year and shall file a report with the Controller no later than May 1st of each
24		year, proposing, if necessary, an adjustment to the fees to ensure that costs are
25		fully recovered and that fees do not produce significantly more revenue than

1		required to cover the costs of operating the program.	The Controller shall adjust			
2		fees when necessary in either case.
