1	Team regarding the discharge of homeless patients in San Francisco.]
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3	Resolution endorsing the Healthcare Action Team's recommendations for procedures
4	on homeless patients hospital discharge, including more respite beds, a streamlined
5	discharge process, distribution of information sheets, utilization of transitional care
6	programs, expansion of the Ombudsman office and no discharges on Fridays.
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8	WHEREAS, There are several hundred seniors and persons with disabilities who are
9	currently homeless and living on the street or in shelters in San Francisco; and
10	WHEREAS, There are currently 60 respite beds available for homeless people who
11	are recovering from acute illness or surgical procedures; and,
12	WHEREAS, These respite beds are accessible only to patients who are inpatient at
13	San Francisco General Hospital; and,
14	WHEREAS, Discharge planners in hospitals other than San Francisco General have
15	problems accessing services for their patients due to the absence of a streamlined referral
16	process; and,
17	WHEREAS, Homeless persons are often discharged to shelters or resource centers
18	that do not have the capacity to provide the level of care these patients require; and,
19	WHEREAS, Transitional care programs such as the Homecoming Services Network
20	exist that can help housed as well as homeless persons with transitions out of the hospital,
21	including access to services; and,
22	WHEREAS, Patients are not always aware of their legal rights including right to appear
23	plan of care and discharge plan; and,
24	WHEREAS, The HealthCare Action Team (HAT) has produced an information sheet
25	entitled "Preparing to Leave the Hospital" that has been vetted by the community and

approved by the Hospital Council; this information sheet is on file with the Clerk of the Board
of Supervisors in File No, which is hereby declared to be a part of this
resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,
WHEREAS, The San Francisco Long Term Care Ombudsman Office currently
monitors only nursing homes an skilled nursing facilities, but that office endorses an
expansion to include acute care hospitals as well; and,
WHEREAS, Patients who are discharged from acute care hospitals on Fridays have a
greater chance of death or readmission than patients discharged on other days of the week; a
study indicating this is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.
, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully
herein; and,
WHEREAS, These issues have been identified and documented by the Hospital
Council of Northern and Central California, hospital administrators, discharge planners, social
workers, shelter operators, police, advocates for the homeless, homeless persons, and
others; now, therefore, be it
RESOLVED, That In the absence of affordable housing there need to be more
accessible and appropriate respite beds in the shelter system available for homeless patients;
and, be it
FURTHER RESOLVED, That these respite beds need to be accessible to all homeless
patients, there needs to be a streamlined referral procedure from all hospitals and skilled
nursing facilities; and, be it
FURTHER RESOLVED, That transitional care case management programs like the
Homecoming Services Network need to be included in the discharge planning process for
patients without homes; and, be it

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1	FURTHER RESOLVED, That hospitals shall include a resource directory informing
2	homeless patients of the resources available to them in the community and informing patients
3	of their legal rights regarding the procedures to appeal their plan of care; and, be it
4	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Long Term Care Ombudsman Office
5	be expanded to include acute care hospitals; and, be it
6	FINALLY RESOLVED, That there will be no discharge of homeless patients, housed of
7	otherwise on Fridays unless the patient specifically agrees to this in writing.
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
