

1 [Recreation of the Community Land Trust Task Force for the purpose of finishing the Report]

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3 **Resolution re-creating the Community Land Trust Task Force and re-appointing Peter**
4 **Doty, Marianne Love, Lotus Yee Fong, Ada Chan, Lisa Feldstein, Rene Cazenave, Marc**
5 **Solomon, James Tracy, Rick Lewis, Ash Kumar Gujral, Philip Williams, and Mark**
6 **Wilson, for the purpose of adopting a draft report, reporting back to the Board and**
7 **sunset its operations within two months of the adoption of this resolution.**
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10 WHEREAS, By Resolution No. 680-01, passed by the Board of Supervisors on August
11 8, 2001, the Board established a Community Land Trust Task Force (“Task Force”) consisting
12 of 16 members; and

13 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors directed the Task Force to make policy
14 recommendations to the Board in seven specifically identified areas; and,

15 WHEREAS, The Board directed the Clerk of the Board to provide the Task Force with
16 research assistance by a legislative analyst; and,

17 WHEREAS, The Board further directed the Task Force to issue a comprehensive
18 report to the Board and sunset its operations no later than six months from the date of the
19 appointment of its members; and,

20 WHEREAS, The Board appointed members of the Task Force on December 3, 2001
21 by Resolution No. 951-01; and,

22 WHEREAS, The Board decreased the membership of the Task Force and added
23 other matters for its consideration and extended the Task Force’s operation for an additional
24 four months until October 3, 2002 by Resolution No. 338-02; and,
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1 WHEREAS, Members of the Task Force were drafting a report when the Task Force
2 expired in October 2002; now, therefore, be it

3 RESOLVED, That the Community Land Trust Task Force be re-created and re-
4 appointed, pursuant to Resolutions No. 680-01, 951-01, 617-02, and 338-02 for the purpose
5 of finishing the report; and, be it

6 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San
7 Francisco does hereby re-appoint the hereinafter designated persons to serve as members of
8 the Task Force for the term specified:

9 Peter Doty, re-appointment, seat 1, must represent San Francisco neighborhoods;

10 Marianne Love, re-appointment, seat 2, must represent San Francisco neighborhoods;

11 Lotus Yee Fong, re-appointment, seat 3, must represent San Francisco

12 neighborhoods;

13 Ada Chan, re-appointment, seat 4, must represent San Francisco neighborhoods;

14 Lisa Feldstein, re-appointment, seat 5, must represent San Francisco neighborhoods;

15 Rene Cazenave, re-appointment, seat 6, must be an affordable housing advocate or
16 nonprofit housing developer;

17 Marc Salomon, re-appointment, seat 7, must be a tenant advocate;

18 James Tracy, re-appointment, seat 8, must be a homeless advocate;

19 Rick Lewis (residency requirement waived), re-appointment, seat 9, must be a member
20 of an existing community land trust organization;

21 Ash Kumar Gujral, re-appointment, seat 10, must be a person experienced in the
22 private financing of housing and experienced as a licensed realtor;

23 Philip Williams (residency requirement waived), re-appointment, seat 11, must be a
24 person experienced in public financing of housing;

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1 Marc Wilson, re-appointment, seat 12, must represent the small business community
2 and be nominat4ed by the City's Small Business Commission or the San Francisco Chamber
3 of Commerce; and, be it

4 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency
5 requirement for Rick Lewis and Philip Williams, as allowed in cases where no qualified City
6 resident, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to Section 4.101 of the City Charter that
7 requires person(s) appointed to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by
8 legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San
9 Francisco; and, be it

10 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Task Force is directed to issue a comprehensive
11 report to the Board of Supervisors and sunset its operations no later than two months from
12 the adoption of this resolution.

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
