[Approving agreement to decommission power plants and withdrawal of bid] APPROVING AN AGREEMENT WITH PACIFIC GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY TO DECOMMISSION HUNTERS POINT POWER PLANT AND WITHDRAW CITY'S BID TO PURCHASE HUNTERS POINT POWER PLANT AND POTRERO POWER PLANT.

This entire section is new.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco: Section 1. Findings.

- In response to the mandate of the California Legislature, as set forth in Α. Assembly Bill 1890, and the direction of the California Public Utilities Commission, Pacific Gas and Electric Company ("PG&E") has elected to divert itself of the Hunters Point and Potrero Power Plants ("Power Plants") located in San Francisco.
- B. The City has an interest in ensuring a reliable long-term supply of electricity to the City and its inhabitants, as well as an interest in protecting the local environment and the health and welfare of San Franciscans.
- C. If the City does not acquire the Power Plants, they will be sold to third parties through an auction process, and the City will have only very limited control over the operator of the Power Plants.
- D. Many citizens in the City have urged the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission ("SFPUC") and the Board of Supervisors to consider the purchase of the Power Plants so that the City can address issues of air pollution, public health impact, reliable electricity, energy conservation, and the use of alternative forms of energy.
- E. Coincident with the SFPUC's selection of CMS/Wellhead as a partner to finance the purchase of the Power Plants, PG&E informed the City that it would no longer sell the Power Plants to the City through a negotiation, but rather that the City should purchase the Power Plants through the auction.

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- F. The City filed a motion with the California Public Utilities Commission to require that the auction of the power plant include in the bidding consideration of the direct price, other financial benefits for the rate payers and non-price factors.
- G. PG&E has agreed to decommission the Hunters Point Power Plant if the City agrees to settle the above litigation by withdrawing its bid for the power plants.

Section 2. Settlement Agreement

The City agrees to settle the litigation now pending before the California Public Utilities Commission in the matter of Application of Pacific Gas and Electric Company for Authorization To Sell Certain Generating Plants And Related Assets Pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 851, File No. A 98-01-008, pursuant to the terms of the attached and incorporated settlement agreement.
