3	Ordinance (1) amending the San Francisco Police Code by amending Section 2.26 to
4	increase the annual license fees for Place of Entertainment Permits and Extended
5	Hours Premises Permits, and (2) making findings pursuant to the California
6	Environmental Quality Act, Public Resources Code Section 21080(b)(8)(A), that the
7	adjustments to the annual license fees are not "projects" and that such annual license
8	fees are imposed for the purpose of meeting operating expenses of the Entertainment
9	Commission, including employee wage rates, fringe benefits and other direct and
10	indirect overhead charges attributable to such annual licenses.

12	deletions are <i>strikethrough italics Times New Roman</i> . Board amendment additions are <u>double underlined</u> .
13	Board amendment deletions are strikethrough normal.
14	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
15	
16	Section 1. Findings.
17	The Board of Supervisors finds and declares the following:
18	The San Francisco Entertainment Commission, established effective July 1, 2003,
19	assumed responsibility from the Police Department for issuing "entertainment-related
20	permits," including permits for places of entertainment and extended hours premises, as set
21	forth in Articles 15.1 and 15.2 of the San Francisco Police Code.
22	As part of the enabling legislation creating the Entertainment Commission, the Board of
23	Supervisors established a policy to set fees for entertainment-related permits and associated
24	annual licenses at levels sufficient to cover the estimated annual operating costs of the
25	Commission. This ordinance amends the existing annual license fees for licenses associated

1	with Place of Entertainment permits (Police Code Sections 1060.1-1 and 2.27) and Extended
2	Hours Premises permits (Police Code Sections 1070.1-1 and 2.27). As set forth in the
3	analysis prepared by the Controller's Office, contained in Board of Supervisors File No,
4	the City's estimated annual costs of the Entertainment Commission, including legal services
5	provided by the City Attorney's Office, commission hearings and meetings, staff, employee
6	wage rates, fringe benefits and associated direct and indirect overhead costs attributable to
7	the Commission's ongoing regulatory responsibilities with respect to businesses holding such
8	permits, is reflected in the revised annual license fees.
9	The annual license fee increases imposed by this ordinance will take effect beginning
10	with fiscal year 2006-2007, and will be adjusted annually for inflation or deflation according to
11	the relevant Consumer Price Index, as determined by the Controller, pursuant to Section 2.31
12	of the Police Code. As a result of prior inflation adjustments, the current annual license fee for
13	the 2005-2006 fiscal year for Place of Entertainment permits is \$352.21, and for Extended
14	Hours Premises permits is \$370.00. This ordinance increases the annual license fees for
15	Place of Entertainment permits by \$99.79, from \$352.21 to \$452.00, and for Extended Hours
16	Premises permits by \$100, from \$370.00 to \$440.00.
17	
18	Section 2. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by amending Section
19	2.27, to read as follows:
20	
21	SEC. 2.27. SCHEDULE OF LICENSE FEES FOR PERMITS ISSUED BY THE
22	POLICE DEPARTMENT OR ENTERTAINMENT COMMISSION.
23	The following license fees are payable to the Tax Collector for permits issued by the
24	Police Department or Entertainment Commission and, when applicable, for their renewal:

1	Section 3. CEQA Findings.
2	The Board of Supervisors finds that the annual license fees for Place of Entertainment
3	permits authorized by Section 1060.1-1 of the San Francisco Police Code and the annual
4	license fees for Extended Hours Premises authorized by Section 1070.1-1 of the San
5	Francisco Police Code are not "projects" as defined by the California Environmental Quality
6	Act pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 21080(b)(8)(A). The Board finds that the
7	annual license fees for such permits, as amended by this ordinance, are for the purpose of
8	meeting operating expenses, including employee wage rates and fringe benefits.
9	
10	Section 4. Operative Date.
11	The increases to the annual license fees made by the amendment to Police Code
12	Section 2.27 shall become operative on July 1, 2006.
