

1 [Expand treatment capacity for homeless addicts in San Francisco through residential  
2 treatment and service coordination.]

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4 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH) to**  
5 **accept and expend retroactively a grant in the amount of \$499,999 for the first year of a**  
6 **three year grant from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration**  
7 **(SAMHSA) to establish the homeless addict vocational and educational network**  
8 **(HAVEN) and to enter into an agreement for the use of these funds; for the period of**  
9 **September 30, 2002 to September 29, 2003.**

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11 WHEREAS, SFDPH was awarded a grant from SAMHSA to establish a homeless  
12 addict vocational and educational network in San Francisco; and,

13 WHEREAS, SAMHSA has agreed to reimburse SFDPH in the amount of \$499,999 for  
14 the first year under the terms of this award; and,

15 WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the funds SAMHSA requires SFDPH to enter  
16 into an agreement (“The Agreement”), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of  
17 Supervisors in File No \_\_\_\_\_, which is hereby declared to be a part of this  
18 resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,

19 WHEREAS, The grant budget includes provision for indirect costs of \$1,723; now,  
20 therefore, be it

21 RESOLVED, That SFDPH is hereby authorized to accept and expend retroactively a  
22 grant in the amount of \$499,999 from SAMHSA; and, be it

23 FURTHER RESOLVED, That SFDPH is hereby authorized to accept and expend the  
24 grant funds in accordance with the requirements set forth in the Agreement pursuant to San  
25 Francisco Administrative Code section 10-170-1; and, be it

1 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the  
2 Agreement on behalf of the City; and, be it

3 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller is directed to designate the positions  
4 created under the grant as "G" or grant-funded positions, which would terminate when the  
5 grant expires.
