8	Section 1. The Board of Supervisors hereby submits to the qualified voters of the City
9	and County, at an election to be held on March 5, 2024, a proposal to amend the Charter of the
10	City and County by adding Section 4.130, to read as follows:

14	SEC. 4.130. DEPARTMENT OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT.
15	(a) There shall be a Department of Emergency Management. The Mayor shall appoint a
16	Director of the Department of Emergency Management who shall serve as department head for
17	the Department. The Director, at the time of appointment, must have a total of at least ten years
18	of employment, experience, or professional service in any of the following fields, singly or
19	cumulatively: firefighting, law enforcement, public health, or military service, or in the fields of
20	disaster management or emergency preparedness and relief, at the local, state, and/or federal
21	level. At least five years of that employment, experience, or professional service must be at a
22	management level. The Director shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor and shall report
23	directly to the Mayor. The Department shall include such officers and employees as are
24	authorized pursuant to the budgetary and fiscal provisions of the Charter.
25	(b) On the date this Section 4.130 is added to the Charter, the Director of the

Department of Emergency Management or, if applicable, person serving in an acting capacity as

Director, shall in the first case continue to be Director serving at the pleasure of the Mayor, and in the second case shall continue to serve temporarily in an acting capacity as Director. If, at that time, there is a person serving in an acting capacity as Director, and if at any time the position of Director is vacant, the position shall be filled in accordance with subsection (a). # LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Charter Amendment - Establishing the Department of Emergency Management in the Charter]

Describing and setting forth a proposal to the voters at an election to be held on March 5, 2024, to amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco to establish within the Charter the Department of Emergency Management, the position of the Director of the Department, and the Director's qualifications and appointing authority.

#### Existing Law and Amendments to Current Law

The Department of Emergency Management was created via ordinance and is codified in Administrative Code Section 2A.200. Administrative Code Section 2A.200 (a) established the Department, the Department Director position, required qualifications for the Director, and the Director's appointing authority. Subsections (b) – (d) include additional Department requirements.

### Amendments to Current Law

The Charter amendment does not make substantive changes to the Department of Emergency Management nor to the Department Director position. The Charter amendment essentially replicates the language in Administrative Code Section 2A.200 (a) in order to establish the Department and the position of Department Director within the Charter. The Charter amendment does not incorporate Administrative Code Section 2A.200 (b) – (d). Those sub-sections remain in the Administrative Code.

The Charter amendment also establishes that the individual serving as Department Director, or acting Department Director, on the date the Charter Amendment language is added to the Charter, can continue to serve in that capacity.

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
