- investments and income from any source which leases, rents or operates from property under the jurisdiction of the Recreation and Park Commission, or which provides, or contracts with the City and County of San Francisco or the Recreation and Park Commission to provide, services (including construction, repair and maintenance), equipment, materials, supplies, vehicles, or other items of use to the Recreation and Park Commission or the Recreation and Park Department, or which may foreseeably do so in the future, or which has done so within two years prior to any time period covered by a statement of economic interest, and his or her status as a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or holder of any management position in any such business entity.
- (b) **Disclosure Category 3.** Persons in this category shall disclose all income from, and investments in, any business entity which does business in the jurisdiction, or has done business in the jurisdiction within two years prior to any time period covered by a statement of economic interest, or which may foreseeably do business in the jurisdiction in thefuture, and his or her status as a director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or holder of any management position in any such business entity.
