4	amending Section 8 to increase the fees charged by the Board of Appeals and making

9	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
10	Section 1. Findings. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated
11	in this Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public
12	Resources Code sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
13	Supervisors in File No and is incorporated herein by reference.
14	Section 2. The San Francisco Business and Tax Regulations Code is hereby amended
15	by amending Section 8, to read as follows:
16	SEC. 8. METHOD OF APPEAL TO THE BOARD OF APPEALS.
17	Except for variance decisions, appeals to the Board of Appeals shall be taken within 15
18	days from the making or entry of the order or decision from which the appeal is taken.
19	Appeals of variance decisions shall be taken within 10 days. Appeals shall be taken by filing a
20	notice of appeal with the Board of Appeals and paying to said Board at such time a filing fee
21	as follows:
22	(a) Zoning Administrator, Planning Department, Director of Planning and
23	Planning Commission.
24	(1) For each appeal from the Zoning Administrator's variance decision the fee shall be \$400
25	<u>\$857.28</u> .

- 1 (2) For each appeal from any order, requirement, decision or other determination (other than a
- 2 variance) made by the Zoning Administrator, the Planning Department or Commission or the
- 3 Director of Planning, including an appeal from disapproval of a permit which results from such
- 4 an action, the fee shall be \$400 \$857.28.
  - (b) Department of Building Inspection.
- 6 (1) For each appeal from a Department of Building Inspection denial, conditional approval or
- 7 granting of a residential hotel or apartment conversion permit the fee shall be \$350 \$750.12.
- 8 (2) For each appeal from the granting or denial of a building demolition, or other permit (other
- 9 than residential hotel conversion) the fee shall be \$100 \(\frac{\$214.32}{}\).
- 10 (3) For each appeal from the imposition of a penalty only the fee shall be \$200 \$428.64.
- 11 (c) Police Department.
- 12 (1) For each appeal from the denial or granting of a Police permit or license issued to the
- owner or operator of a business the fee shall be \$250 535.80; for each such permit or license
- issued to an individual employed by or working under contract to a business, the fee shall be
- 15 \$100 \$214.32.

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- 16 (2) For each appeal from the revocation or suspension of a Police permit or license the fee
- shall be \$250 \$535.80 for an entity or individual.
- 18 (d) **Department of Public Works.** For each appeal from the decision of the Director of
- the Department of Public Works concerning street tree removal by a City agency,
- commission, or department the fee shall be \$75 \$160.74.
- 21 (e) For each appeal from any other order or decision the fee shall be \$200 \$428.64.
- 22 (f) For requests for rehearing under Section 16 of this Article the fee shall be \$100 \$282.
- 23 (g) For requests for jurisdiction the fee shall be \$100 \$214.32.
- 24 (h) For requests for rescheduling hearings the fee shall be \$141.

- 1 (i) An exemption from paying the full fee specified in Subsections (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), and
- 2 (g) <u>and (h)</u> herein may be granted upon the filing under penalty of perjury of a declaration of
- 3 indigency on the form provided and approved by the Board. All agencies of the City and
- 4 County of San Francisco are exempted from these fees.
- 5 Notice of appeal shall be in such form as may be provided by the rules of the Board of
- 6 Appeals.
- 7 On the filing of any appeal, the Board of Appeals shall notify in writing the department, board,
- 8 commission, officer or other person from whose action the appeal is taken of such appeal. On
- 9 the filing of any appeal concerning a structural addition to an existing building, the Board of
- 10 Appeals shall additionally notify in writing the property owners of buildings immediately
- 11 adjacent to the subject building.
- 12 The Board of Appeals shall fix the time and place of hearing, which shall be not less than 10
- nor more than 45 days after the filing of said appeal, and shall act thereon not later than 60
- days after such filing or a reasonable time thereafter. In the case of a fixed pedestal newsrack
- permit, a place of entertainment permit or an extended-hours premises permit, the Board of
- Appeals shall set the hearing not less than 15 days after the filing of said appeal, shall act
- thereon not more than 30 days after such filing, and shall not entertain a motion for rehearing.
- 18 With respect to any decision of the Board of Appeals related to any "dwelling" in which
- 19 "protected class members" are likely to reside (each as defined in Administrative Code
- 20 Chapter 87), the Board of Appeals shall comply with the requirements of Administrative Code
- 21 Chapter 87 which requires, among other things, that the Board of Appeals not base any
- decision regarding the development of such units on information which may be discriminatory
- to any member of a "protected class." Pending decision by the Board of Appeals, the action of
- such department, board, commission, officer or other person from which an appeal is taken,
- excluding (1) actions of revocation or suspension of permit by the Director of Public Health

1	when determined by the Director to be an extreme public health hazard and (2) actions of the	е
2	Zoning Administrator or Director of the Department of Building Inspection stopping work und	er
3	or suspending an issued permit, shall be suspended.
