



Board Qualifications:

The Food Security Task Force shall consist of up to 15 members. Voting members, other than department representatives and the School District representative, shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Supervisors.

The Board of Supervisors shall appoint one voting member from: the Department of Human Services of the Human Service Agency, the Department of Aging and Adult Services of the Human Services Agency, the Department of Public Health - Nutrition Services, the Department of Public Health - Office of Food Systems, the Department of Children, Youth and their Families, the Recreation and Park Department and the Economic and Workforce Development Department. The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall invite the San Francisco Unified School District to submit a representative for appointment by the Board as a voting member of the Task Force.

In addition, the Board may appoint as voting members of the Task Force up to seven representatives of community-based organizations that provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco residents. Such community members shall be nominated by the Task Force and may include but are not limited to representatives from organizations serving food in the following prgoram types: home-delivered meals; congregate meals for seniors; food bank; free dining room; multi-service agency serving families and youth; shelter meals; and faith-based organizations. No organization shall have more than one representative on the Task Force.

San Francisco BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Members other than department representatives shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Supervisors.

The Task Force shall invite a member of the public to sit as a non-voting member of the Task Force representing San Francisco residents.

The Department of Public Health, shall provide clerical assistance and logistical support to the Task Force and its committees.

The Food Security Task Force shall recommend to the Board of Supervisors legislative action and city-wide strategies that would increase participation in federally funded programs such as the Food Stamp program, Summer Food Service, the Child and Adult Care Food Program, the Homeless Children Nutrition Program, the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women Infants and Children (WIC), the National School Lunch Program and the National School Breakfast Program. The Task Force shall also provide general advice and assistance to the Board of Supervisors with regard to funding priorities, legislative action, and city polices on addressing hunger and enhancing the food security of San Francisco residents in addition to any other issues within the Task Force's expertise.

Reports: The Food Security Task Force shall prepare an annual assessment of the state of hunger and food insecurity in San Francisco with recommendations for funding, programs, and policy. The Task Force shall submit the hunger and food insecurity assessment to the Board of Supervisor. The Board of Supervisors may adopt legislation to implement the recommendations.

Thereafter, the Task Force shall submit status reports on progress toward implementing the recommendations and meeting the goals to the Board bi-annually.

Sunset Date: One year after the passage of this ordinance, the Food Security Task Force shall submit a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors on whether the Task Force should continue in operation. Unless this measure creating the Task Force is reauthorized and extended by the Board by resolution prior to January 31, 2012, Sections 470.1 and 470.2 shall expire by operation of law and the City Attorney shall cause those sections to be removed from future editions of the Code.
