2 URGING THE CALIFORNIA ASSEMBLY TO SUPPORT ASSEMBLY BILL 1055 ("AB 1055")

3 WHEREAS, According to the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission,
4 the past two decades have seen a dramatic increase in playground related injuries to
5 children; and,

6 WHEREAS, Nationwide, more than 200,000 preschool and elementary aged children a
7 year are treated in hospital emergency rooms for injuries that occurred on playground
8 equipment; and,

10 WHEREAS, Severe injuries, including fractures, internal injuries, concussions,
11 dislocations, amputations, and crushing account for approximately 36 percent of all
12 playground injuries; and,

14 WHEREAS, AB 1055 would enact the Playground Safety and Recycling Act of 1999,
15 which would establish, until July 1, 2003, the playground safety and recycling grant program
16 to provide grants for the purpose of improving or replacing playgrounds; now therefore, be it

17 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
18 urges the California Assembly to approve AB 1055.




