5 WHEREAS, San Francisco has been a leading force in the efforts to provide health
6 coverage for all its citizens; and

7 WHEREAS, San Francisco was the second county in the United States to provide low-
8 cost health coverage to children under 18 regardless of immigration status, and the first
9 county in the country to extend this Health Kids program to 18-24 year olds; and

10 WHEREAS, Public and private partnerships between the San Francisco Health Plan
11 and community organizations such as the San Francisco Organizing Project have resulted in
12 thousands of children receiving health coverage; and

13 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Organizing Project, as part of the PICO California
14 Project, and the 100% Campaign are launching the Californians for Healthy Kids campaign
15 on April 13th to ensure all California children have healthcare; now, therefore be it

16 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
17 do hereby proclaim April 13, 2005 as Healthcare for All Children Day.
