

1 [Urging the Immigrant Rights Commission to fund and manage the San Francisco Day
2 Laborer Program.]

3 **Resolution urging the Immigrant Rights Commission to explore and advise the Board**
4 **of Supervisors on the management of the Day Laborer Program.**

6 WHEREAS, Continuity of the San Francisco Day Laborer Program is important to
7 immigrants seeking employment and to the community overall; and

8 WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors appropriated \$100,000 in FY 2002-2003 and
9 appropriated \$90,000 in FY 2003-2004 for the management of the San Francisco Day Laborer
10 Program and to date \$25,000 of these funds have been expended for the intended purpose of
11 the management of the Program, representing reimbursement for expenses through
12 September 30, 2002; and

13 WHEREAS, The contract awarded in April of 2000 by the Mayor’s Office of Community
14 Development to La Raza Centro Legal for the management of the Program expired on June
15 30, 2002, and contract extensions expired September 30, 2002, and to date no organization
16 has been awarded with a contract to manage the Program; and

17 WHEREAS, The Mayor’s Office of Community Development (MOCD) July 2002 and
18 August 2002 RFP’s to competitively bid the San Francisco Day Laborer Program did not yield
19 a successful selection of the Program’s manager; and

20 WHEREAS, On September of 2002, the Citizens Committee on Community
21 Development of the MOCD transferred responsibility for the administration of the Program to
22 the Immigrant Rights Commission in September of 2002; and

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

1 WHEREAS, MOCD transferred responsibility for selecting a contractor to manage the
2 San Francisco Day Laborer Program to the Mayor's Office of Neighborhood Services (MONS)
3 in September of 2002 but to date the MONS has not awarded the contracts; and

4 WHEREAS, The Immigrant Rights Commission is charged with improving the quality of
5 life of immigrants within our community; now therefore be it

6 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors Urges the Immigrant Rights Commission to
7 explore and advise the Board of Supervisors on the management of the Day Laborer
8 Program; and be it

9 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Immigrant Rights Commission should explore and
10 advise the Board of Supervisors regarding (1) whether entering into a month-to-month
11 contract with a nonprofit organization to ensure continuity of services is appropriate pending
12 the outcome of the MONS RFP process, and (2) whether reimbursing organizations for
13 services already rendered for the management of the Program is appropriate; and be it

14 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Immigrant Rights Commission should, once the RFP
15 is finished, review the RFP and monitor the MONS process of choosing a nonprofit to run it;
16 and be it

17 FURTHER RESOLVED, Once the Contract is awarded, the Immigrant Rights
18 Commission should manage the contract after the selection.
