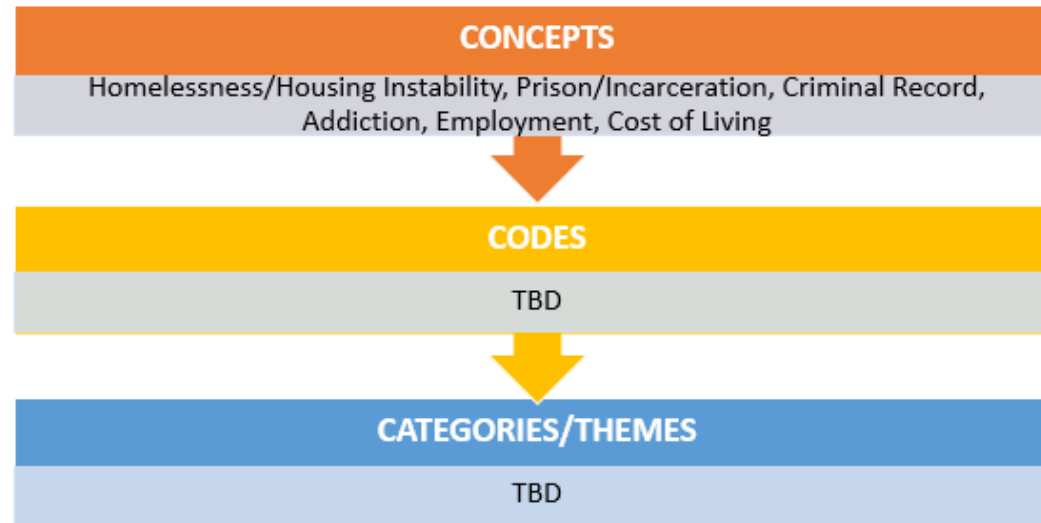

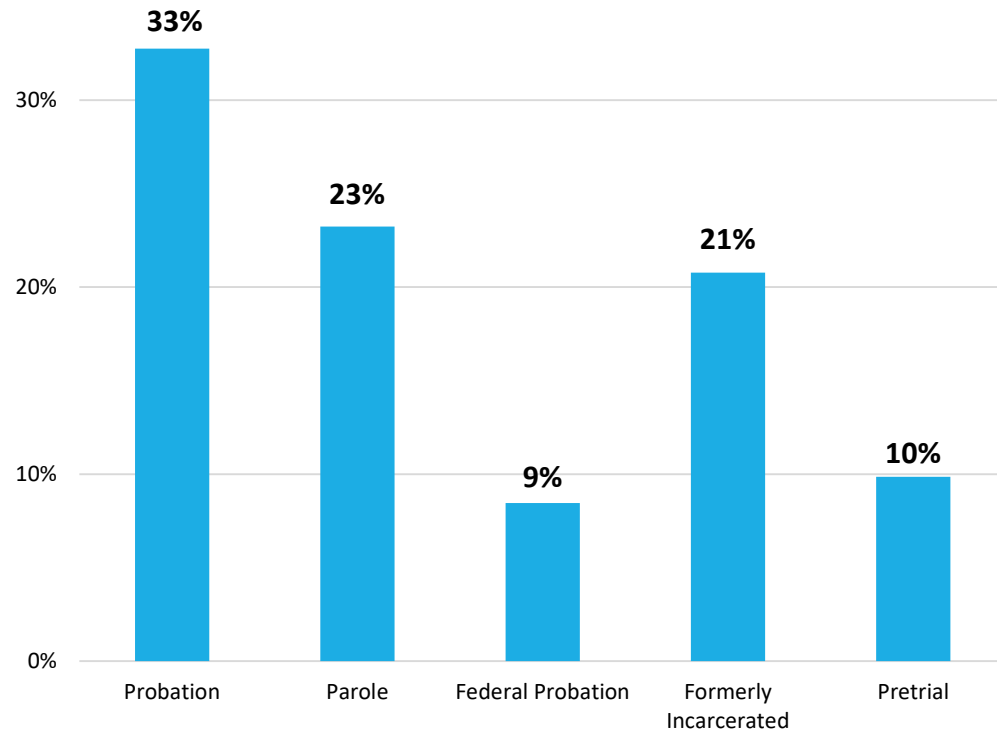

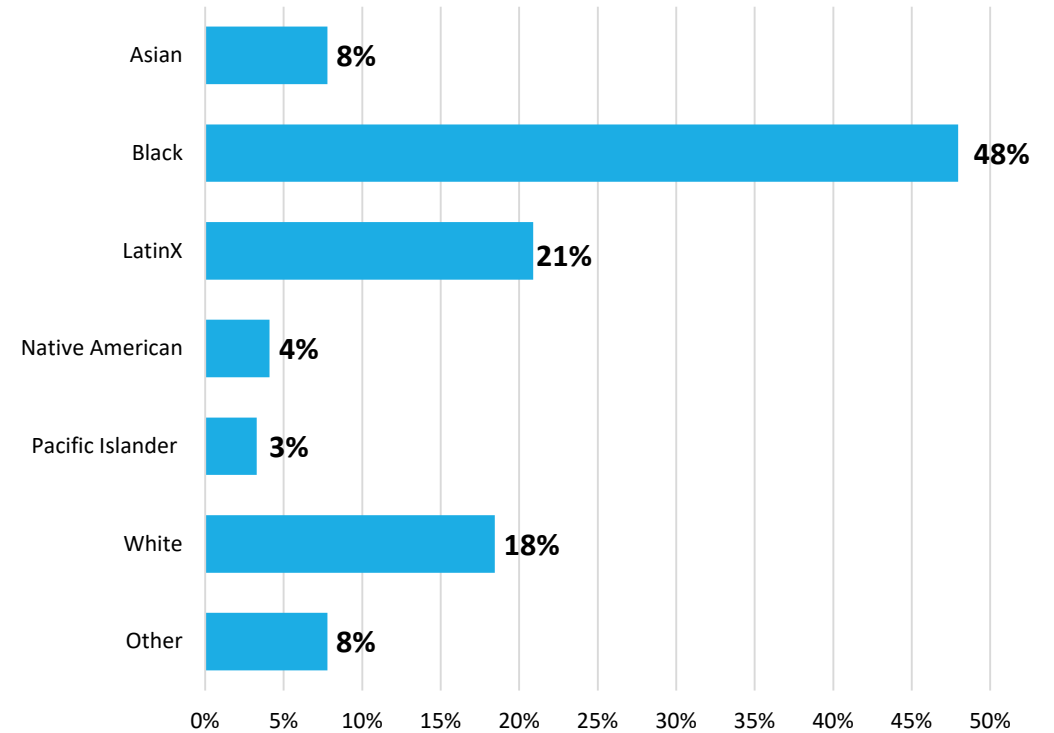

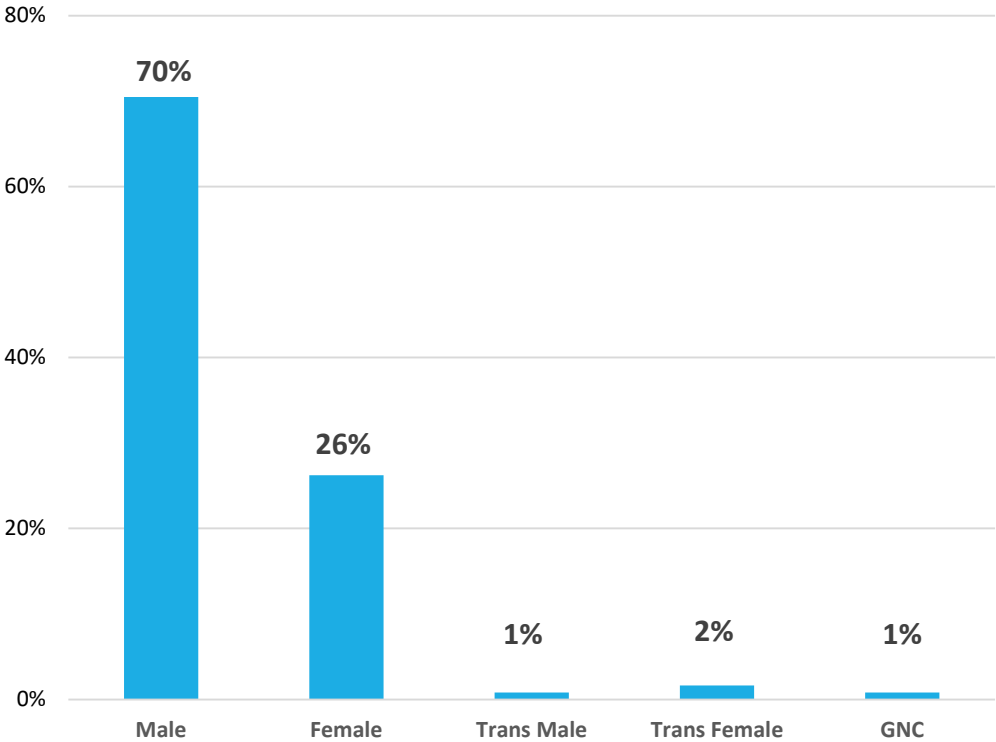

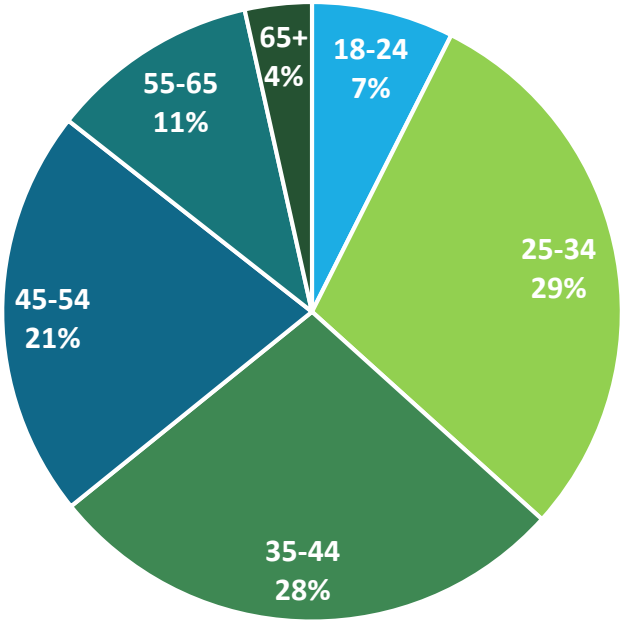

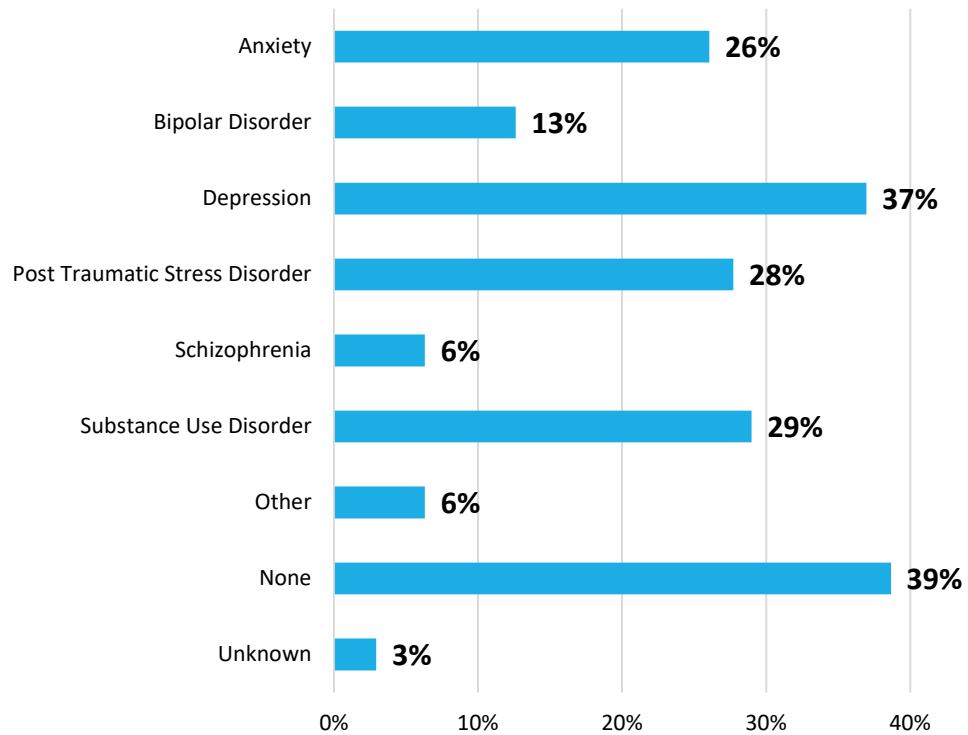

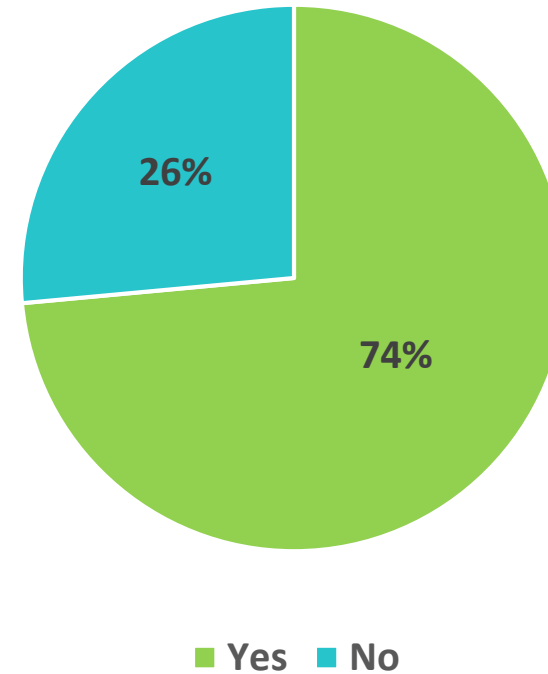

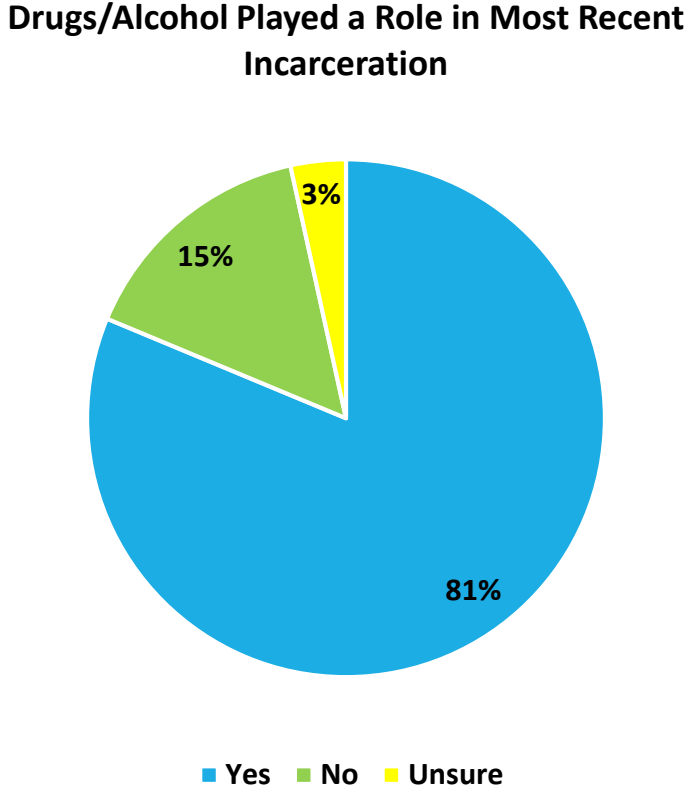
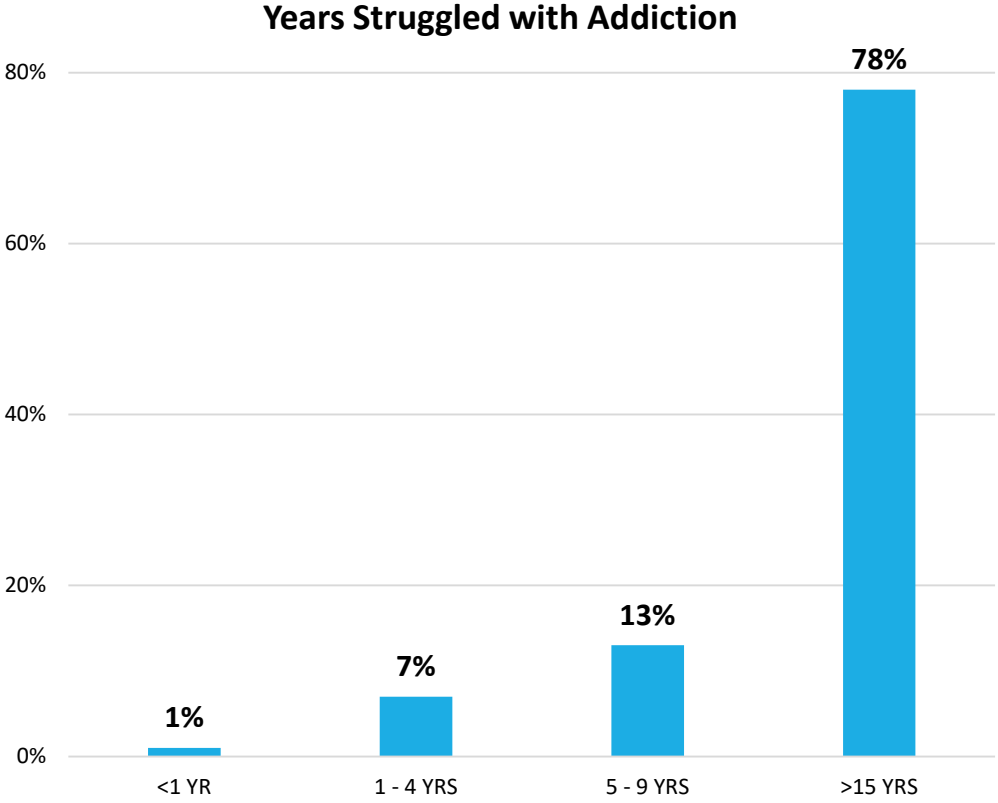
Self Reported Professional Diagnosis



% of Respondents with Substance Use History

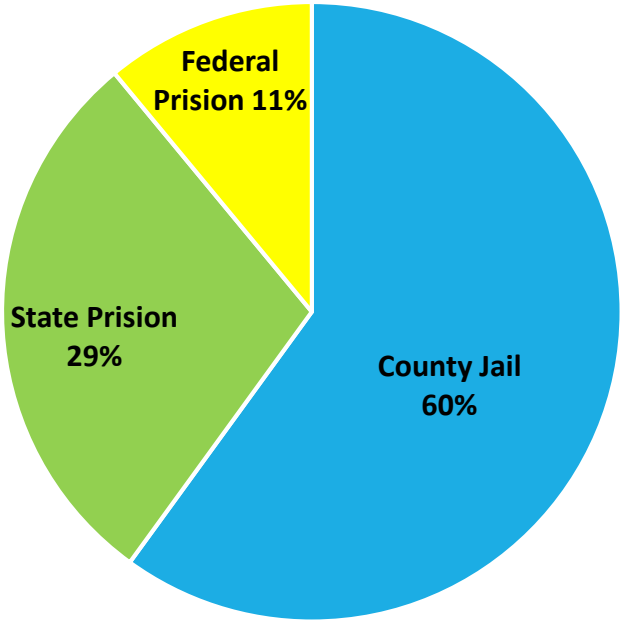

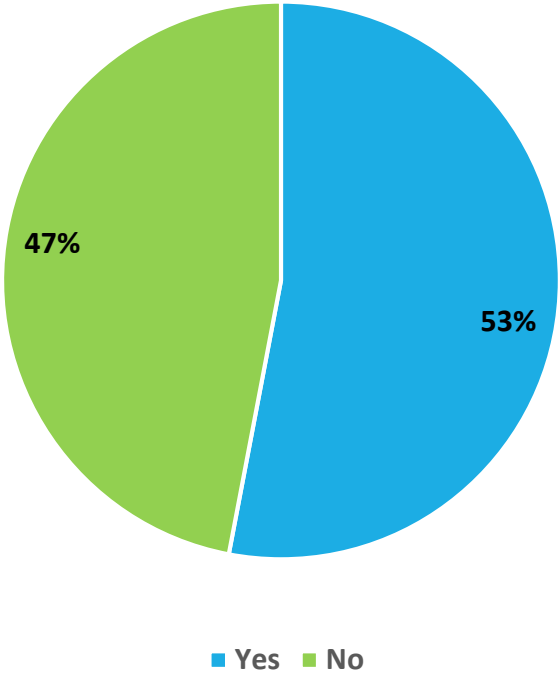

Most Recent Incarceration

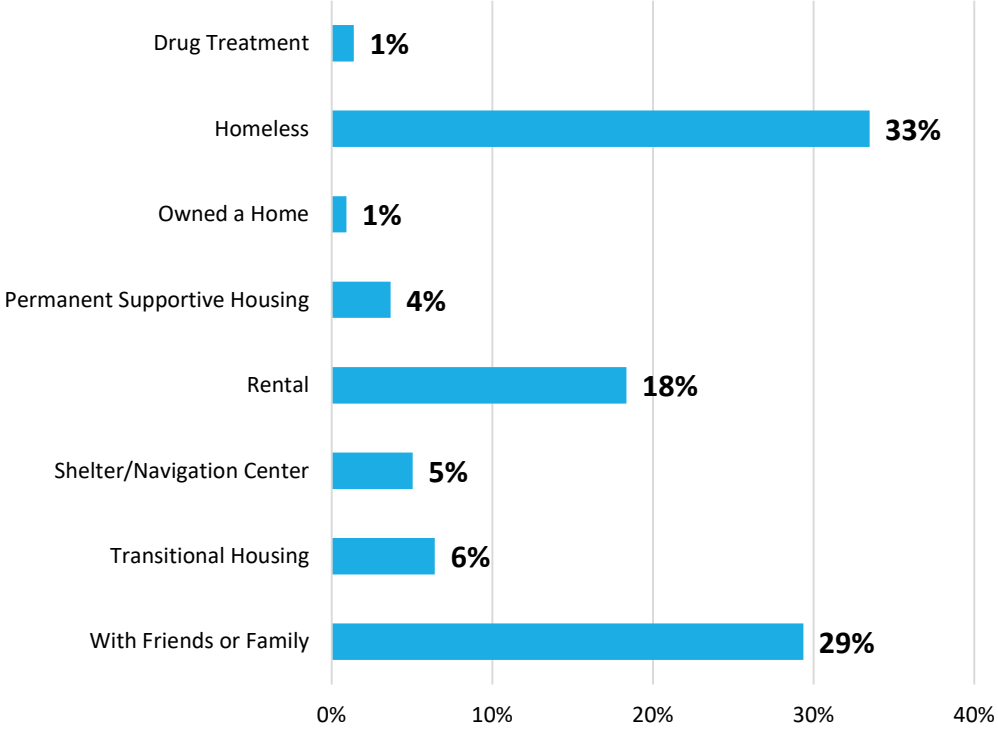


Know Where Living Upon Release

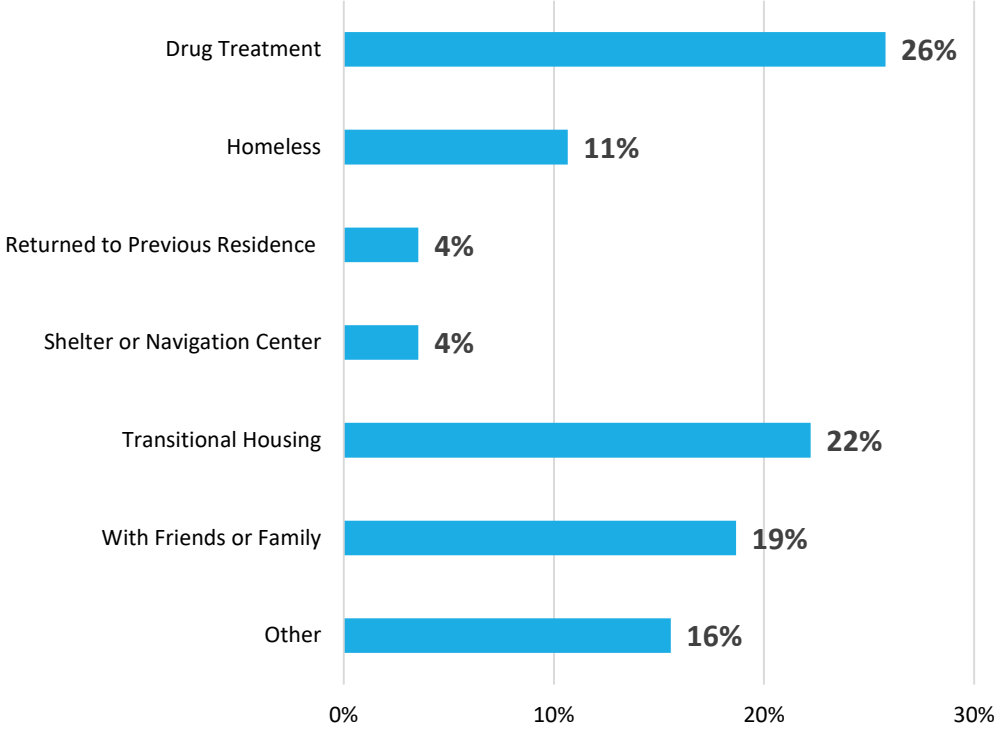

Living Situation Prior to Incarceration

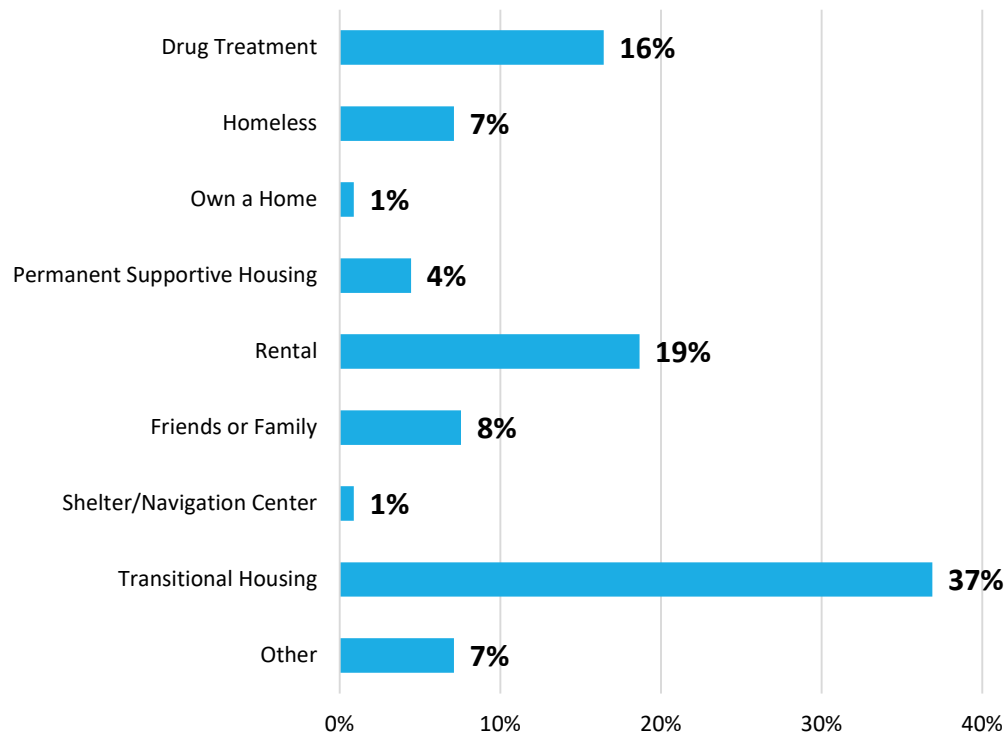


Living Situation Upon Release

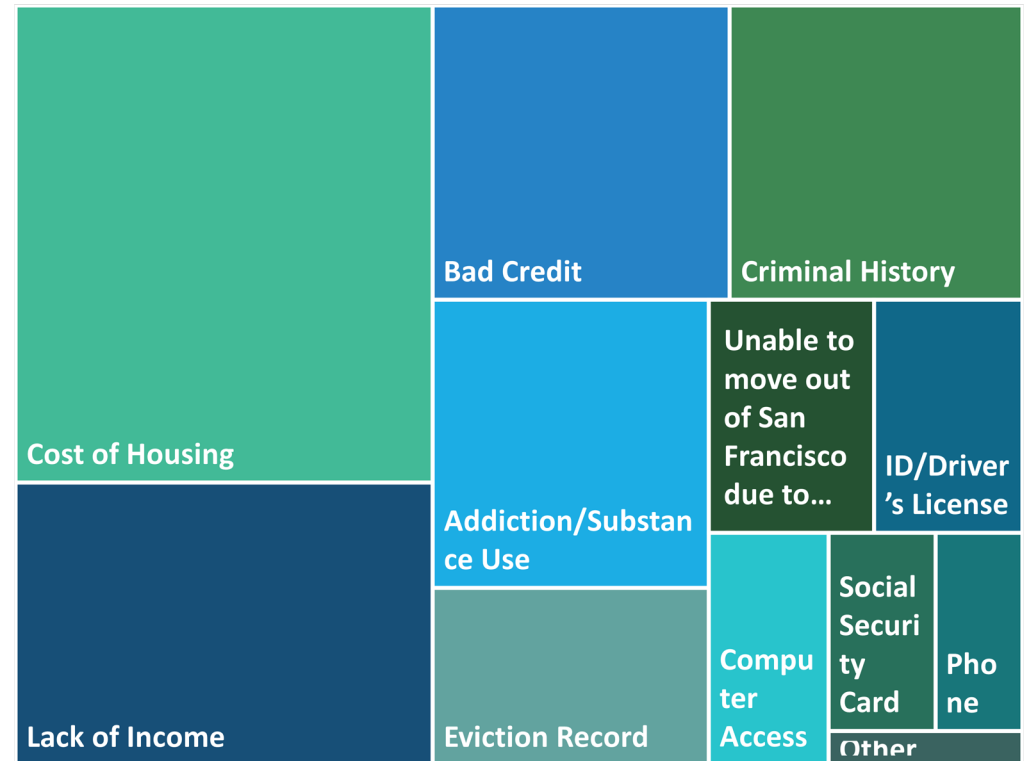

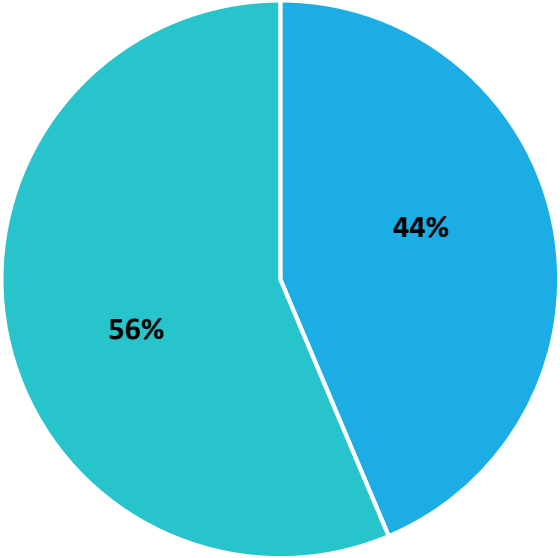


Barriers to Obtaining Permanent Housing



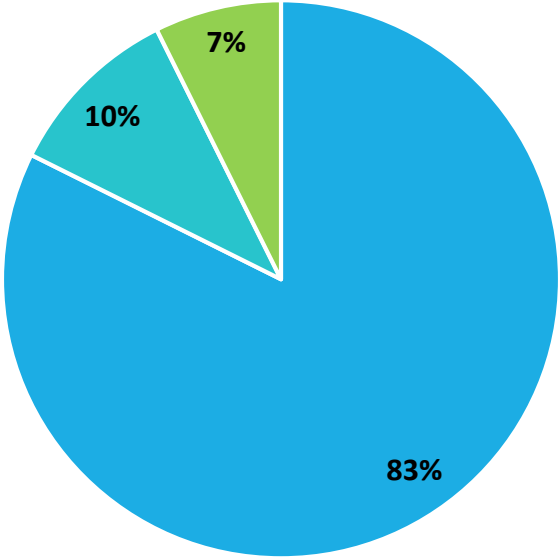

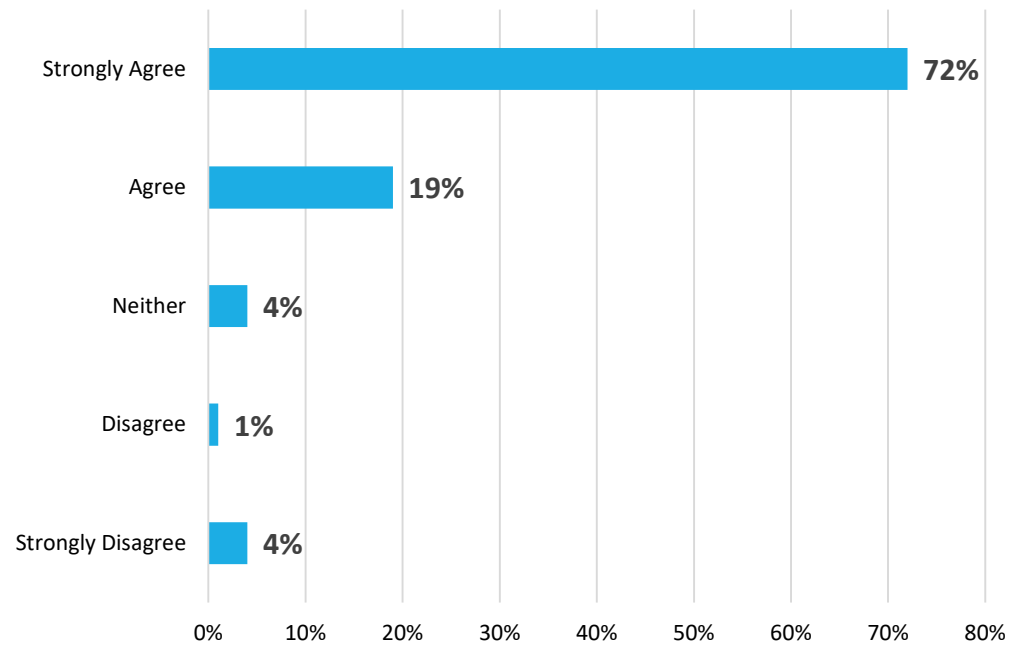
Outcome of Coordinated Entry



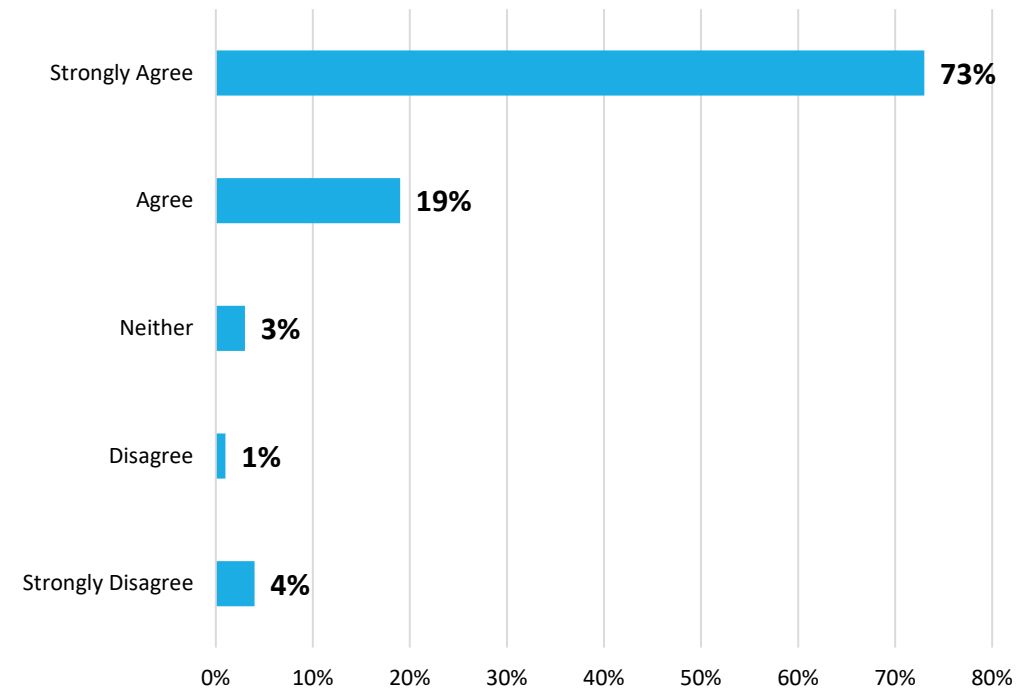

Is there a need for a 24/7 stabilization center for unhoused justice involved people exiting from jail/prison?

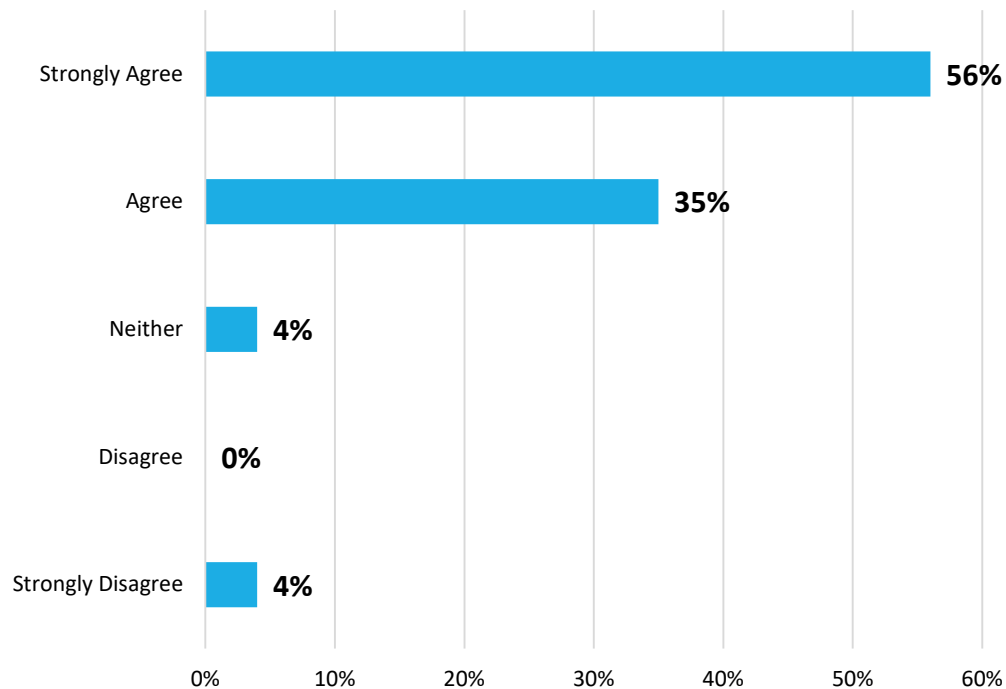


Is there a need for long term transitional housing (1-3 years) for justice involved people?
