

**AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO
AIRPORT AMENITIES AND BUSINESS SERVICES IN THE INTERNATIONAL
TERMINAL LEASE NO. 13-0202
AT SAN FRANCISCO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT**

THIS AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO INTERNATIONAL TERMINAL AIRPORT AMENITIES AND BUSINESS SERVICES LEASE NO. 13-0202 AT THE SAN FRANCISCO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (“**Amendment**”), dated as of MAY 03 2021 (“**Effective Date**”), is entered by and between the CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO, a municipal corporation, acting by and through its AIRPORT COMMISSION (“**City**”), as landlord, and AIRPORT TRAVEL AGENCY, INC. (“**Tenant**”), as tenant.

RECITALS

A. On September 17, 2013, by Resolution No. 13-0202, the Airport Commission awarded Lease No. 13-0202 to Tenant (the “**Lease**”). On December 17, 2013, by Resolution No. 455-13, the Board of Supervisors approved the Lease. Pursuant to the Lease, Tenant operates that certain business service facility located at the San Francisco International Airport (the “**Airport**”) in the International Terminal (as further described in the Lease, the “**Premises**”).

B. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the severe downturn in enplanements and concession sales, and to preserve customer service and maintain revenue, Staff has determined that it would not be prudent to initiate a competitive process for replacing Tenant at this time. City and Tenant have agreed to extend the term of the Lease through June 30, 2023 with the condition that the Airport Director, at his sole and absolute discretion, may terminate earlier by providing six months’ advance written notice to the tenant.

C. All capitalized terms not otherwise defined herein shall have the same meaning given to them in the Lease.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and for valuable consideration the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, City and Tenant hereby agree to amend the Lease as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. **Recitals.** The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are incorporated herein by this reference as if fully set forth herein.
2. **Term.** The Expiration Date is extended to June 30, 2023. City, acting by and through the Airport Director, may terminate the Lease earlier at its sole and absolute discretion by providing six months’ advance written notice to Tenant.
3. **Minimum Annual Guarantee (“MAG”).** Subject to Section [4.14] of the Lease [Severe Decline in Enplanements], from and after the Effective Date, the MAG shall continue to be payable and subject to upward adjustment in accordance with the Lease.

4. **Additional City and Other Governmental Provisions.** The following provisions are hereby incorporated as new sections of the Article 19 of the Lease:

19.27 Vending Machines; Nutritional Standards and Calorie Labeling Requirements. Tenant may not install or permit any vending machine on the Premises without the prior written consent of the Airport Director. Any permitted vending machine will comply with the food and beverage nutritional standards and calorie labeling requirements set forth in San Francisco Administrative Code Section 4.9-1(c), as may be amended from time to time (the “**Nutritional Standards Requirements**”). Tenant will incorporate the Nutritional Standards Requirements into any contract for the installation of a vending machine on the Premises or for the supply of food and beverages to that vending machine. Failure to comply with the Nutritional Standards Requirements or to otherwise comply with this Lease section will be a material breach of this Lease. Without limiting City’s other rights and remedies under this Lease, City will have the right to require the immediate removal of any vending machine on the Premises that is not permitted or that violates the Nutritional Standards Requirements.

19.28 Consideration of Salary History. Tenant shall comply with Administrative Code Chapter 12K (“**Chapter 12K**”), the Consideration of Salary History Ordinance or “Pay Parity Act.” Tenant is prohibited from considering current or past salary of an applicant in determining whether to hire the applicant or what salary to offer the applicant to the extent that such applicant is applying for employment to be performed on this Lease or in furtherance of this Lease, and whose application, in whole or part, will be solicited, received, processed or considered, whether or not through an interview, in the City or on City property. The ordinance also prohibits employers from (1) asking such applicants about their current or past salary or (2) disclosing a current or former employee’s salary history without that employee’s authorization unless the salary history is publicly available. Tenant is subject to the enforcement and penalty provisions in Chapter 12K. Information about and the text of Chapter 12K is available on the web at <https://sfgov.org/olse/consideration-salary-history>. Tenant is required to comply with all of the applicable provisions of Chapter 12K, irrespective of the listing of obligations in this Section. Tenant shall include this obligation in all subleases, licenses, sublicenses and any other contracts for work to be performed in the Premises entered into by Tenant.

19.29 Local Hire. Any undefined, initially-capitalized term used in this Section shall have the meaning given to such term in San Francisco Administrative Code Section 23.62 (the “**Local Hiring Requirements**”). All Alterations under the Lease are subject to the Local Hiring Requirements unless the cost for such work is (a) estimated to be less than \$750,000 per building permit or (b) meets any of the other exemptions in the Local Hiring Requirements. Tenant agrees that it shall comply with the Local Hiring Requirements to the extent applicable. Before starting any Alteration, Tenant shall contact City’s Office of Economic Workforce and Development (“**OEWD**”) to verify if the Local Hiring

Requirements apply to the work (i.e., whether the work is a “Covered Project”). Tenant shall include, and shall require its subtenants to include, a requirement to comply with the Local Hiring Requirements in any contract for a Covered Project with specific reference to San Francisco Administrative Code Section 23.62. Tenant shall cooperate, and require its subtenants to cooperate, with City in any action or proceeding against a contractor or subcontractor that fails to comply with the Local Hiring Requirements when required. A contractor’s or subcontractor’s failure to comply with this Section will enable City to seek the remedies specified in San Francisco Administrative Code Section 23.62 against the breaching party.

19.30 Resource-Efficient City Buildings. Tenant acknowledges that City has enacted Chapter 7 of the San Francisco Environment Code relating to green building requirements. Tenant hereby agrees that it shall comply with all applicable provisions of Chapter 7, including but not limited to those relating to Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certification.

19.31 All Gender Toilet Facilities. If applicable, Tenant will comply with San Francisco Administrative Code Section 4.1-3 requiring at least one all-gender toilet facility on each floor of the Premises in any building where extensive renovations are made by Tenant. An “all-gender toilet facility” means a toilet that is not restricted to use by persons of a specific sex or gender identity by means of signage, design, or the installation of fixtures, and “extensive renovations” means any renovation where the construction cost exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the cost of providing the toilet facilities required by Administrative Code Section 4.1-3. If Tenant has any question about applicability or compliance, Tenant should contact Building Inspection and Code Enforcement (BICE) for guidance.

19.32 Federal Fair Labor Standards Act. The Lease incorporates by reference the provisions of 29 USC §201, the Federal Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA), with the same force and effect as if given in full text. The FLSA sets minimum wage, overtime pay, recordkeeping, and child labor standards for full and part time workers. Tenant has full responsibility to monitor compliance to the referenced statute or regulation for its employees in the Premises. Tenant must address any claims or disputes that arise from this requirement directly with the U.S. Department of Labor – Wage and Hour Division.

19.33 OSHA. The Lease incorporates by reference the requirements of 29 CFR §1910 with the same force and effect as if given in full text. Tenant retains full responsibility to monitor its compliance and their contractor’s and subcontractor’s compliance with the applicable requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (29 CFR §1910). Tenant must address any claims or disputes that pertain to a referenced requirement directly with the U.S. Department of Labor – Occupational Safety and Health Administration.”

5. **Entire Agreement.** This Amendment contains all of the representations and the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter of this agreement. Any prior correspondence, memoranda, agreements, warranties, or written or oral representations relating to the subject matter of the Amendment are superseded in their entirety by this Amendment. No prior drafts of this Amendment or changes between those drafts and the executed version of this Amendment shall be introduced as evidence in any litigation or other dispute resolution proceeding by any party or other person, and no court or other body should consider such drafts in interpreting this Amendment.

6. **Miscellaneous.** This Amendment shall bind, and shall inure to the benefit of, the successors and assigns of the parties hereto. This Amendment is made for the purpose of setting forth certain rights and obligations of Tenant and City, and no other person shall have any rights hereunder or by reason hereof as a third-party beneficiary of otherwise. Each party hereto shall execute, acknowledge and deliver to each other party all documents, and shall take all actions, reasonably requested by such other party from time to time to confirm or effect the matters set forth herein, or otherwise to carry out the purposes of this Amendment. This Amendment may be executed in counterparts with the same force and effect as if the parties had executed one instrument, and each such counterpart shall constitute an original hereof. No provision of this Amendment that is held to be inoperative, unenforceable or invalid shall affect the remaining provisions, and to this end all provisions hereof are hereby declared to be severable. Time is of the essence of this Amendment. This Amendment shall be governed by the laws of the State of California. Neither this Amendment nor any of the terms hereof may be amended or modified except by a written instrument signed by all the parties hereto.


7. **Full Force and Effect.** Except as specifically amended herein, the terms and conditions of the Lease shall remain in full force and effect.




