Resolution recognizing every November as Veterans Month in the City and County of San Francisco, and urging all San Franciscans to recognize the veterans in their community with acts of kindness.

WHEREAS, There are approximately 25,000 veterans residing in the City and County of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Service members and their families make numerous sacrifices during their military service, with some making the ultimate sacrifice; and

WHEREAS, Vietnam War veterans returning home received neither the fanfare nor the benefits bestowed upon World War II veterans, but were instead met with anger in San Francisco and institutional indifference throughout most of the United States; and

WHEREAS, Mental health issues affect more than half of veterans in San Francisco, especially those from the Vietnam era; and

WHEREAS, It was the goal of late Mayor Edwin M. Lee to have zero homeless veterans in 2018 but there are still over 600 homeless veterans in San Francisco, according to the latest point in time count in 2019; and

WHEREAS, Many service members leaving the military and returning to the San Francisco Bay Area are not prepared for the transition home and have a range of needs that cannot be addressed by a single organization; and

WHEREAS, The need to embrace these veterans and welcome them to San Francisco as a city of rebirth and opportunity is an essential element of our City's fabric; and

WHEREAS, Veterans are now, once again, returning to San Francisco for employment and to establish new lives with their families; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors recognizes every November as Veterans Month in San Francisco and urges all San Franciscans to recognize veterans in their community through acts of kindness and by the displaying of the flag of the United States; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco is committed to continue providing education to City and County of San Francisco employees about the importance of recognizing veterans in the community; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco reaffirms the commitment to prioritize the hiring of veterans; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco hereby emphasizes the need for increased outreach for veterans mental health services; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco supports the mission and work of Swords to Plowshares, Chinatown Community Development Center, and other veterans service organizations in providing housing, compassionate support, and education services to our veterans; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco is unwavering in its support for policies and programs that assist veterans in our community.
