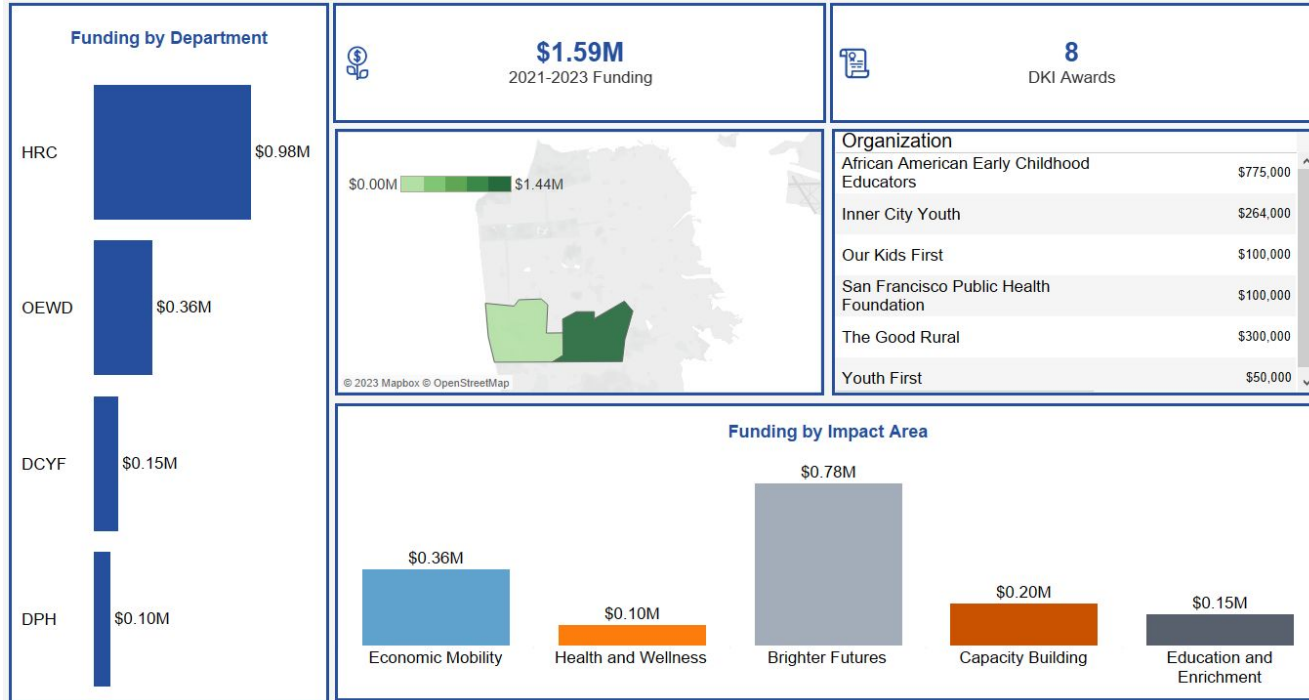


Dream Keeper Initiative Funding Distribution in the OMI/Lakeview Area

During 2021-2023, the Dream Keeper Initiative has invested a total of \$1.59m in the OMI/Lakeview area. This is based on the neighborhood that the grantee is located. However additional DKI grants have provided services in or to residents of OMI/Lakeview.



HRC Funded Dream Keeper Initiative Programs

The African American Early Childhood Educators (AAECE)-Kinder

- Funding amount: \$425,000
- Provide kindergarteners with trauma informed care, culturally responsive (anti-racist) educational workshops, and performance evaluations.
- Grantee has distributed 65 Kindergartener Kits, and held 10 workshops/events.

HRC Funded Dream Keeper Initiative Programs

The African American Early Childhood Educators (AAECE)-Stem Frenzy

- Funding amount: \$350,000
- Provides STEM opportunities to younger children.
- The STEM Frenzy Event hosted 800 youth and families from 7 schools in District 10 & 11. The program also offered 39 workshops and events throughout the year.

HRC Funded Dream Keeper Initiative Programs

The Good Rural Novation Lab

- Funding amount: \$200,000
- Provides specialized courses, training, and supports to people seeking to become certified child care providers.
- Roughly 50-75 participants per year are actively engaged in one or more service (primarily OMI/Lakeview & Mercy Housing/Sunnydale residents).

Dream Keeper Initiative Mini-grants

HRC has also implemented mini-grant awards of up to \$5,000 through two grantees, Collective Impact & Homeless Children's Network. Mini-grants have been awarded to several organizations in OMI/Lakeview area. Further detail is available upon request.

Outreach and Engagement

We provided over 400 books both for CBO to use/distribute and during tabling community events with OMICPP, AAEECE, Youth 1st. (everybody reads kits and boxed books).

Campaign for Solidarity – OMI Invest Black received solidarity kits and hosted an event putting kits together and distributing along Ocean Avenue and in the Lakeview neighborhood.

Opportunities for All

OFA – Intentionally recruited from the OMI Neighborhood. Partnered with Inner City Youth/Young Community Developers, Balboa High School, June Jordan School of Equity, Community Youth Center, Youth First, OMI Family Resource Center, Our Kids First, Minnie and Lovie Ward Recreation Center, Stonestown YMCA, and to recruit young people for summer programs.
