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3	<u>Resolution</u> authorizing the Executive Director of the Department of Parking and Traffic			
4	to apply for retroactively, accept and expend up to \$169,262 in California Department of			
5	Transportation Environmental Justice and Community-Based Planning Program funds			
6 7	for the 24 <sup>th</sup> Street and Tenderloin Pedestrian Safety and Access Planning Project.			
8	WHEREAS, The California State Assembly enacted the Environmental Justice and			
9 10	Community-Based Planning Grant Program in the year 2000 which made available			
11	\$8,500,000, for each of two years in state funds to the California Department of			
12	Transportation (Caltrans) to provide funding support for public and intermodal transportation			
13	planning studies, training and development of transit planning professionals, demonstration			
14	projects for environmental justice in planning, and transportation/land use planning projects			
15 16	that support livable communities; and,			
17	WHEREAS, The California Department of Transportation issued a Request For			
18	Proposals in April of 2001, to local and regional agencies and municipalities throughout the			
19	State on a competitive basis; and,			
20	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Department of Parking and Traffic created the Livable			
21	Streets Program, including the Pedestrian Program, in the year 2000 to better serve the			
22	walking public in the City; and,			
23	WHEREAS, 24 <sup>th</sup> Street, Cesar Chavez Street, Geary Street, O'Farrell Street, Jones			
<ul><li>24</li><li>25</li></ul>	Street and Hyde Street have been identified by the Department of Parking and Traffic as			

1	being among the 31 top-ranked Livable Streets Corridor Projects where pedestrian safety and			
2	access and transit access are concern of the City of San Francisco; and,			
3	WHEREAS, The Department of Parking and Traffic is requesting an Environmental			
4	Justice Planning Grant totaling	anning Grant totaling \$169,262, from the first cycle of the Environmental Justice		
5	and Community-Based Planning Grant Program, to create Pedestrian Safety and Access			
6	Plans for the 24 <sup>th</sup> /Cesar Chavez Street Corridor from Mission Street to Potrero Ave			
7 8	for the arterials in the Tenderloin District; and,			
9	WHEREAS, The Enviro	nmental Justice Planning P	rogram requires a local match of	
10	\$55, 278 which will be paid for with monies from departmental and non-state funds; now,			
11	therefore, be it			
2	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby authorize the Executive			
3	Director of the Department of Parking and Traffic to apply retroactively, accept, and expend			
4	up to \$398,000 in State Pedestrian Safety Program grant funds and up to \$169,261 in State			
5 6	Environmental Justice and Community-Based Planning Grant funds for the aforementioned			
7	transportation projects with the required local match funds of \$55,278.
