

2 **Resolution commemorating the 100th anniversary of Girl Scouts and declaring March**
3 **11 – 17, 2012, as “Girl Scout Week” in the City and County of San Francisco.**

5 WHEREAS, March 12, 2012, marks the 100th anniversary of Girl Scouts of the USA,
6 which began in 1912 when Juliette “Daisy” Gordon Low gathered 18 girls in Savannah,
7 Georgia, to provide them the opportunity to develop physically, mentally, and spiritually; and

8 WHEREAS, For 100 years, Girl Scouting has helped build millions of girls and women
9 of courage, confidence, and character who act to make the world a better place; and

10 WHEREAS, The award-winning Girl Scout Leadership Program helps girls discover
11 themselves and their values, connect with others, and take action to make the world a better
12 place; and

13 WHEREAS, The Girl Scout Gold Award, the highest honor in Girl Scouting, requires
14 girls to make a measurable and sustainable difference in their community and honors
15 leadership in the Girl Scout tradition; and

16 WHEREAS, Core programs around Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math
17 (STEM), environmental stewardship, healthy living, financial literacy, and global citizenship
18 help girls develop a solid foundation in leadership; and

19 WHEREAS, Through the dedication, time, and talent of thousands of volunteers of
20 different backgrounds, abilities, and areas of expertise, the Girl Scout Program is brought to
21 more than 3300 girls in grades K-12 in the City of San Francisco; now, therefore, be it

22 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco do
23 hereby applaud the Girl Scouts of the USA for their 100 years of leadership and expertise as
