3 **Resolution approving the FY2014-2015 Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS**
4 **(HOPWA) Program; and authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the City and County of San**
5 **Francisco, to apply for, accept, and expend the City's FY2014-2015 HOPWA Program**
6 **entitlement from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development in the**
7 **amount of \$8,241,932 and to expend program income and reprogrammed funds in the**
8 **amount of \$647,857 for a combined total of \$889,789 for the period of July 1, 2014,**
9 **through June 30, 2019.**

11 WHEREAS, Under the AIDS Housing Opportunity Act, Subtitle D of Title VIII of the
12 National Affordable Housing Act of 1990, Public Law Number 101-625, the City and County of
13 San Francisco is eligible to apply for and receive funds from the Housing Opportunities for
14 Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) Program; and

15 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco anticipates receiving approximately
16 \$8,241,932 in 2014 HOPWA Program funds from HUD, and estimates approximately
17 \$210,360 in Program Income from previous HOPWA grants and 437,497 in HOPWA funds
18 from previous years that have not been expended (Reprogrammed Funds), for a combined
19 total of approximately \$8,889,789; and

20 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is responsible for distributing a
21 portion of the HOPWA funds to the County of San Mateo as the lead agency for the San
22 Francisco Eligible Metropolitan Statistical Area (EMSA); and

23 WHEREAS, The Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development (MOHCD)
24 has prepared programs and a proposed Expenditure Schedule for FY2014-15 HOPWA
25 funding, including the distributions to the County of San Mateo, a copy of which is located in

1 Board File No. 1404R (the "Expenditure Schedule"); and

2 WHEREAS, The proposed grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance
3 amendment; and

4 WHEREAS, The funding agency (HUD) does not allow use of grant on indirect costs;
5 and

6 WHEREAS, An Environmental Review Record has been prepared by the Mayor's
7 Office of Housing and Community Development (MOHCD) and approved by the Certifying
8 Officer for the proposed projects and activities set forth in the Expenditure Schedule with the
9 National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and other applicable statutes and authorities, in
10 particular those cited in 24 CFR Part 58 §§5 and 6, a copy of which is located in Board File
11 No. 140418; and

12 WHEREAS, The Certifying Officer shall follow the provisions of NEPA to confirm and
13 ensure that all projects funded under the HOPWA Program are in compliance with applicable
14 federal regulations and requirements; now, therefore, be it

15 RESOLVED, That the Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco is hereby
16 authorized to apply for, accept, and expend the City's FY2014-2015 HOPWA Program
17 entitlement grant from HUD and expend an estimated \$210,360 in Program Income and
18 \$437,497 in Reprogrammed Funds, all in accordance with the purposes and goals for the
19 funding as generally set forth in the 2010-14 Five Year Consolidated Plan and the
20 Expenditure Schedule; and, be it

21 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby approve the
22 purposes and goals for FY2014-2015 HOPWA Program funding as set forth in the
23 Expenditure Schedule for recipient agencies and departments; and, be it

24 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of
25 indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

1 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into and execute
2 agreements between the City and County of San Francisco and the various agencies
3 consistent with the FY2014-2015 HOPWA Program and the Expenditure Schedule; and, be it

4 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to submit documentation
5 and certifications as may be requested or required by HUD, and to take such additional
6 actions as may be required to apply for, accept and expend the FY2014-2015 HOPWA funds
7 consistent with this Resolution and the goals of the FY2014-2015 HOPWA Program and all
8 applicable legal requirements; and, be it





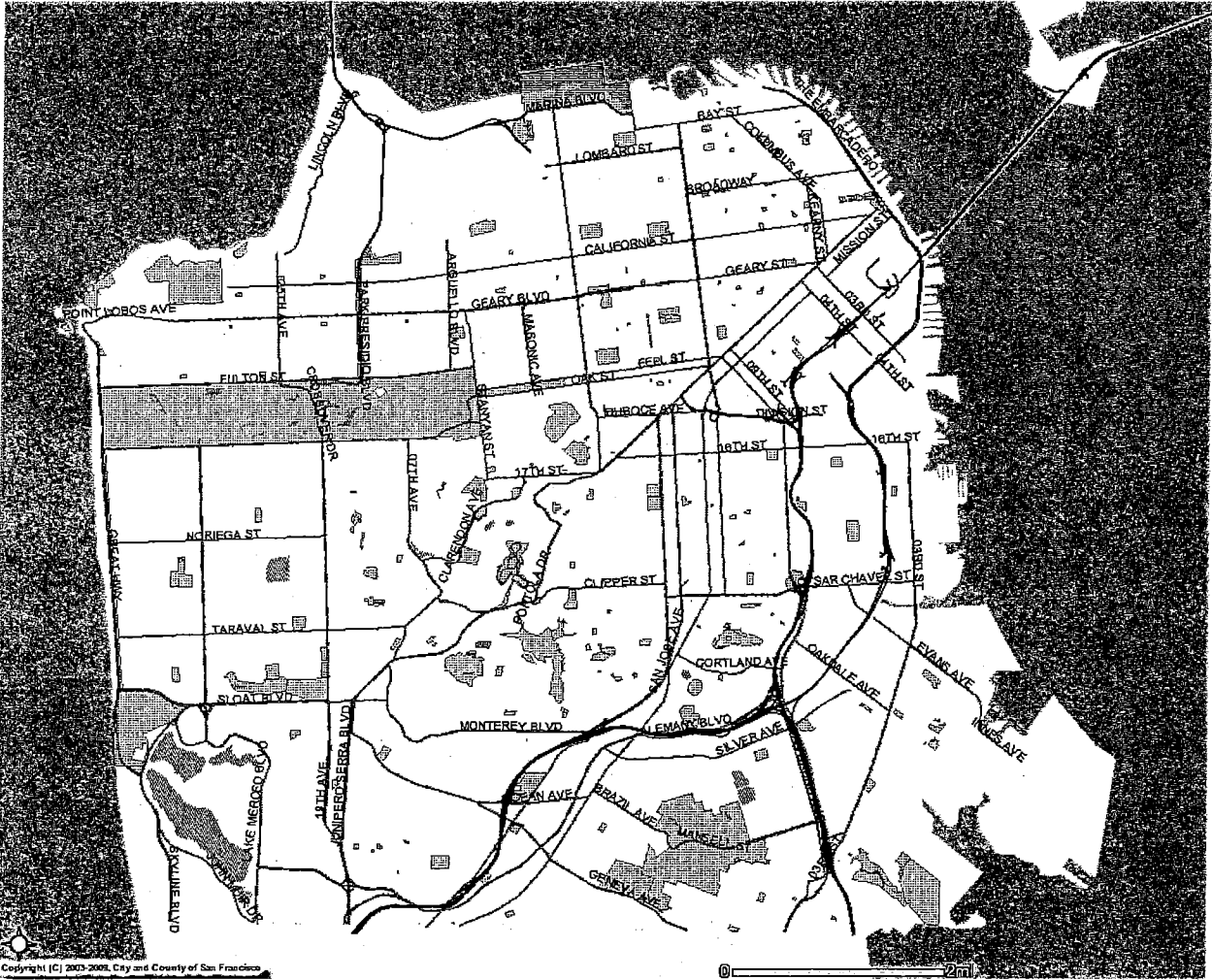
