7	WHEREAS, The California Fair Employment and Housing Act (FEHA) as currently
8	written contains language that preempts local jurisdictions such as San Francisco from
9	enforcing local laws designed to eliminate discrimination in employment and housing; and
10	WHEREAS, This preemption language seriously weakens the ability of San Francisco
11	and other California cities and counties to address discrimination faced by its residents
	because local jurisdictions are restricted from ordering remedies for proven acts of
12	discrimination; and,
13	WHEREAS, After investigating and documenting a serious problem of discrimination,
14	San Francisco and other California cities and counties have chosen and could still choose to
15	add additional protected categories, not covered by FEHA, to local anti-discrimination laws to
16	address serious acts of discrimination faced by community residents; and
17	WHEREAS, Eliminating the preemption language in FEHA would allow individuals
18	suffering from employment or housing discrimination on the basis of a protected category not
19	covered by FEHA to sustain a cause of action in court to seek redress for such discrimination;
20	and;
21	WHEREAS, If the preemption language in FEHA were removed, the enforcement
22	
23	authority of local agencies, such as the San Francisco Human Rights Commission, would be
24	strengthened, increasing their ability to resolve complaints of discrimination, and

6	expresses its strong support for Assembly Bill 18, which would eliminate the preemption
