Whereas, Almost two years ago, a package of three housing proposals aimed at ending the stalemate of production of housing in this City were introduced for Planning Commission review by Supervisor Mark Leno and a broad coalition of housing and planning experts; and,

Whereas, One of these proposals, file 00-2108, that would eliminate floor area ratios in C-3 zoning districts, was determined to have such a high a potential for producing new units - in fact,

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doubling the current 1,000 per year to 2,000 units per year - that it needed a formal Environment Impact Review (EIR) before it could move forward; and,

Whereas, Taken together with file 00-1262, which is scheduled to be heard by the Planning Commission in February and would mandate that 12% of all new units in housing developments of 10 units or more be affordable to renters making 60% of median income and buyers making 100% of median income, these two proposals have the potential to substantially increase the number of new, affordable housing units produced in San Francisco; and,

Whereas, After a number of meetings with Planning Department representatives, funding was specifically dedicated in the Planning Department's 2001-02 budget for the EIR of file 00-2108; and,

Whereas, Without further consultation with the legislative sponsor or the Board of Supervisors about the critical importance and high priority of this EIR funding, the Planning Department decided to reallocate those funds for other purposes, thereby delaying the positive impacts this proposal could have on many San Franciscans in desperate need of housing and assistance with a myriad of social problems; now, therefore be it

Resolved, That the City and County of San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby urges the Planning Department to address the lack of housing in San Francisco and related issues of homelessness, poverty, mental health, substance abuse and economic empowerment by restoring its original commitment to fund the Environmental Impact
