WHEREAS, Midge Wilson founded the Bay Area Women's and Children Center (BAWCC) in 1981, where she served as Executive Director until her retirement in 2022; and

WHEREAS, The BAWCC has created a safe space where women can take a break from their daily lives, rest on a comfortable couch, find community with other women from the neighborhood, receive food, clothing and other necessary supplies, and get referrals to jobs and other important resources; and

WHEREAS, The BAWCC is central to the diverse Tenderloin community, by feeding families, providing clothing and connecting families to essential resources, as well as embarking on multiple special projects as enumerated below; and

WHEREAS, Midge Wilson founded the Angel Child Program at the BAWCC, which has coordinated a special gift-giving program for hundreds of low-income children and youth over many holiday seasons; and

WHEREAS, Midge Wilson's work always started from a place of deep listening to what the community had to say, where she and her team of staff and volunteers conducted regular surveys and door to door inquiries to fully understand the issues that affected the Tenderloin; and

WHEREAS, The intentional survey conducted by BAWCC has been critical in identifying community needs and getting much-needed resources to the neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, Midge Wilson understood the need for parks and kid-safe areas in the Tenderloin, and worked with the community to create four playgrounds, including the Tenderloin Recreation Center; and

WHEREAS, Midge Wilson spearheaded the successful campaign to open an elementary school in the Tenderloin, and the establishment of the Tenderloin Community School was a victory for the community and continues to serve the kids and families residing in the Tenderloin; and

WHEREAS, The BAWCC has provided many services to the Tenderloin Community School over the years, including free dental services, healthy food, after school clubs, technology classes, library programs and youth sports; and

WHEREAS, Midge Wilson was hands-on in the school, as well as her community initiatives, for over four decades by providing many important essential services to families and children and enabled the organization to grow and change to meet the needs of the community; and

WHEREAS, Through her work with the BAWCC, Midge Wilson has made a huge difference in the lives of Tenderloin families; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That in order to celebrate the legacy and contributions of Midge Wilson, there shall be an honorary naming of "Midge Wilson Alley" on Elm Street between Van Ness and Polk Street; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Works is directed to add the honorary street name to its official list of Commemorative Street Names in accordance with Public Works Code, Sections 789, *et seq.*
