This Amendment Number One ("Amendment") to the Housing and Homelessness Incentive Program Agreement ("Agreement") between San Francisco Health Authority doing business as the **San Francisco Health Plan** ("Health Plan" or "MCP"), and the **City and County of San Francisco** ("City"), a municipal corporation, acting by and through the **San Francisco Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing** ("HHIP Grantee"), referenced collectively as parties and individually as party, is effective July 01, 2025.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Health Plan and HHIP Grantee previously entered into a Housing and Homelessness Incentive Program Agreement ("Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 7. of the Agreement, the parties desire to execute this Amendment Number One to amend the Agreement to incorporate grants for the purposes of sustaining funding for the Cardea Enhanced Care in Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) and new funding for Data Integration / Coordinated Entry Predictive Analytics; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend the Agreement to re-number Exhibit A, Exhibit B and Exhibit C; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to extend the term of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to amend the Agreement to reflect these changes.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises set forth below, the Parties agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

- 1. **Exhibit A, Exhibit B** and **Exhibit C** of the Agreement are re-numbered as **Exhibit A-1**, **Exhibit A-2**, and **Exhibit A-3** respectively, and all references to "Exhibit A", "Exhibit B" and "Exhibit C" shall be removed.
- 2. Section 4. <u>Term and Termination</u> of the Agreement is deleted in its entirety and replaced as follows:

This Agreement will commence on the Effective Date and shall continue until December 31, 2025; thereafter, this Agreement shall automatically be renewed on January 1st of each year for a successive one-year period unless terminated earlier by either party as provided in this Section 4.

Either party may terminate this Agreement with or without cause by giving thirty (30) business days prior written notice to the other party. This Agreement will automatically terminate upon the event where HHIP Grantee fails to meet requirements and measurements as outlined in this Agreement and all future Exhibits that may become a part of the Agreement. In the event of an automatic termination, Health Plan will request repayment of unspent grant funds.

Homelessness Incentive Program - Not to Exceed \$6,047,884

This Resolution seeks approval for the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing ("HSH") to retroactively enter into a grant agreement amendment with the San Francisco Health Plan ("SFHP") for the Housing Homelessness Incentive Program ("HHIP"). The Grant Agreement Amendment ("Amendment") has an effective date of July 1, 2025, and a not to exceed amount of \$6,047,884. HSH plans to use HHIP grant funds to continue previously funded activities, expand enhanced onsite services at permanent supportive housing and support data integration and coordinated entry predictive analysis.

HSH appropriated anticipated HHIP grant funds through the FY 2024-2026 Budget and Appropriation Ordinance, adopted by the Board of Supervisors in July 2024. HSH received a draft Amendment from the SFHP on May 21, 2025, and has been working closely with the SFHP to finalize. A final copy of the FY 2024-2026 AAO and final to form copy of the Amendment are on File with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors for this item.

HSH is seeking retroactive authorization from the Board of Supervisors to enter into the Amendment that has an effective date of July 1, 2025 with the SFHP under the City Charter, Section 9.118 that requires Board of Supervisors approval if the anticipated revenue is over \$1,000,000.

Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing ("HSH") to enter into a Grant Agreement Amendment with an effective date of July 1, 2025, between the City and County of San Francisco ("City"), acting by and through HSH, and the San Francisco Health Plan, to continue to provide enhanced onsite services in permanent supportive housing and data integration under the Housing and Homelessness Incentive Program ("HHIP"); amending the existing term of the Grant Agreement through December 31, 2025, with automatic one-year term renewals effective January 1st of each year until the Grant Agreement is terminated by either party; increasing the grant amount by \$2,820,000 for a total not to exceed amount of \$6,047,884; and authorizing HSH to enter into any amendments or other modifications to the amendment that do not materially increase the obligations or liabilities, or materially decrease the benefits to the City and are necessary or advisable to effectuate the purposes of the agreement.
