[Police and Health Codes - Regulation of Cannabis Businesses]

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Ordinance amending the Police Code to extend by one year the possible duration of a 3 Temporary Cannabis Business Permit; and amending the Health Code to increase. 4 from 90 days to 120 days, the time period that the Director of the Office of Cannabis 5 may extend a medical cannabis dispensary's authorization to sell adult use cannabis, 6 and extending by one year to December 31, 2019, the date on which Article 33 (Medical 7 Cannabis Act) expires. Ordinance amending the Police Code by making a number of 8 changes in the regulation of commercial cannabis activity, including, among other 9 things: 1) defining ownership interest for purposes of the Equity Program in a 10 Cannabis Business; 2) modifying the Cannabis Equity Incubator Program 11 requirements; 3) extending by one year the possible duration of a Temporary Cannabis 12 Business Permit; 4) authorizing the Director of the Office of Cannabis to issue 13 Cannabis Business Permits to Medical Cannabis Dispensaries forced to discontinue 14 operations due to a no-fault lease termination before December 31, 2018; 5) modifying 15 the order in which the Director may review and process Cannabis Business Permit 16 applications; 6) revising requirements associated with a Cannabis Business' change in 17 ownership and structure requiring Cannabis Business permit amendments when a 18 change in ownership results in a decrease in an Equity Applicant's Ownership Interest 19 or role in the Cannabis Business: 7) revising Cannabis Business Permit application 20 requirements; 8) requiring Cannabis Businesses to comply with all permit conditions 21 whether or not they are currently engaging in the permitted activity; 9) modifying the 22 amount of Cannabis that may be delivered or sold to a customer; and 10) authorizing 23 Cannabis Microbusinesses to conduct either storefront or delivery sales, but not both, 24 and reducing from four to three the categories of Commercial activity required to 25

2	eligibility requirements for medical cannabis dispensaries seeking authorization to Sell		
3	Adult Use Cannabis, and extending by one year to December 31, 2019 the date on

10	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
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12	Section 1. As introduced, this ordinance proposed revising Administrative Code		
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14	Sections 1602, 1604, 1605, 1606, 1608, 1609, 1613, 1615, 1618, 1622, 1627, 1628, 1629,		
15	and 1634 and Health Code Sections 3322 and 3323. At its regular meeting on October 24,		
16	2018, the Board of Supervisors Rules Committee duplicated the file, and amended this		
17	ordinance to remove the amendments to Administrative Code Sections 1602, 1604, 1606,		
18	1608, 1609, 1613, 1615, 1618, 1622, 1627, 1628, 1629, and 1634 such that this ordinance		
	amends only Administrative Code Sections 1605 and Health Code Sections 3322 and 3323.		
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20	Section 2. Article 16 of the Police Code is hereby amended by revising Section 1605,		
21	to read as follows:		
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23	SEC. 1605. TRANSITION PROVISION.		
24	* * * *		
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1	(h) Duration. A Temporary Cannabis Business Permit issued under this Section 1605
2	shall be valid for a period of 120 days and may be extended for additional <u>120</u> 90-day periods
3	at the discretion of the Director. Notwithstanding the prior sentence, the Director shall not
4	issue a new temporary permit after January 1, 2019, and shall not extend the term of a
5	Temporary Cannabis Business Permit issued to an applicant for a Cannabis Business Permit under
6	this Article 16 past January 1 December 31, 2019.

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9	Section 3. Article 33 of the Health Code is hereby amended by revising Sections 3322
10	and 3323, to read as follows:
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12	SEC. 3322. TRANSITION PROVISION.
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14	* * * *
15	(e) The Director may extend the authorization to Sell Adult Use Cannabis for additional
16	12090-day periods beyond the 120-day period set forth in subsection (d) of this Section 3322
17	upon a finding that:
18	(1) The Office of Cannabis has not had sufficient time to review and process
19	applications for Cannabis Business Permits under Article 16 of the Police Code; and
20	(2) The medical cannabis dispensary has demonstrated good faith compliance
21	with its Equity Plan to the satisfaction of the Director of the Office of Cannabis.
22	The Director's authority under this subsection (\underline{ef}) to extend $\underline{12090}$ -day periods for
23	authorization to sell Adult Use Cannabis may be exercised only at intervals of approximately
24	12090 days, as to each distinct 12090-day period. Thus, for example, the Director may not

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simultaneously authorize two consecutive <u>120</u>90-day extensions for the same medical cannabis dispensary.

SEC. 3323. SUNSET PROVISION.

This Article 33 shall expire by operation of law on December 31, 201918, at which time and II permits authorizing the operation of a Medical Cannabis Dispensary issued under this Article 33 shall be rendered invalid after December 31, 2018, except for those permits issued under this Article 33 where the permit holder has applied for a Police Code Article 16 permit, which shall be rendered invalid on December 31, 2019. Upon expiration of the Article, the City Attorney shall cause it to be removed from the Health Code.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

Section 5. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the ordinance.
